Breakdown:

- \$25.1 Million in actual public funds invested
- \$96 Million in candidate commitments secured
- \$43,439 raised from 114 individual donors



Actual Public Funds Invested: ~\$25.1 Million

- 2021: \$380,000
- 2022: \$14 million (\$9M Cary + \$5M County)
- 2024: \$10.7 million (SmartRide, HEART, shelter, Stable Homes Cary, Housing Fund)

Candidate Commitments: \$96 Million

- 2022: \$13 million (local candidates)
- 2023: \$13 million (Cary and Zebulon candidates)
- 2024: \$70 million (Raleigh City Council candidates)

Note: The Cary Housing Fund has generated \$21 million total to date, with \$5.8M continuing in 2024.

- \$380,000 compensation won for displaced Wellington Park residents
- 600 homeowners attended assembly, won preliminary commitments for the expanded tax assistance program
- 350 households attended virtual assembly with Cary candidates, won support for dedicated housing fund
- 108 Holly Springs residents secured rezoning for 124 affordable housing units
- 120 leaders at the Las Americas press conference helped residents receive outstanding titles
- 25 media stories generated highlighting affordable housing needs
- 5 new member institutions joined



- \$9 million historic affordable housing investment approved by Cary Town Council \$5 million pilot investment from Wake County for housing cost burden relief
- \$13 million total in commitments won from local candidates
- 477 leaders attended assembly with Raleigh City Council candidates
- 3,300+ doors knocked during relational GOTV campaign
- 921 SE Maynard rezoning passed unanimously for affordable housing in Cary



- \$13 million in commitments from Cary and Zebulon candidates
- 2,000 members engaged in a grassroots listening campaign
- 312 leaders ratified three new priorities: affordable housing, mental health, and public transportation
- 600+ members at Cary candidate assembly (largest in recent history)
- 100+ leaders at Zebulon candidate assembly
- 30 leaders toured the Nehemiah housing in Brooklyn with elected officials



- \$70 million in commitments won from Raleigh City Council candidates
- \$10.7 million in public funds invested in addressing community priorities
- \$5.8M continued funding for Cary Housing Fund (\$21M total to date)
- \$3M for permanent low-barrier shelter facility
- \$800K for Stable Homes Cary displacement assistance
- \$600K for Raleigh HEART mental health crisis pilot
- \$538K continued SmartRide microtransit program
- 1,000+ leaders at Raleigh candidate assembly (largest in ONE Wake history)
- 8,000+ petition signatures collected for affordable housing
- \$43,439 raised from 114 individual donors
- 434 members completed leadership development training



- 3 Nehemiah Tours with 8 elected officials and 15 ONE Wake leaders (up from 1 official in previous years)
- Land Blessing of Randleigh Tract for affordable housing development with Mayor Janet Cowell and others
- 1,000+ members attended Accountability Assembly at Watts Chapel MBC for the second consecutive year
- 16 leaders sent to Metro IAF National 7-day training (most in the organization's 80+ year history)
