Reflecting on Another Powerful Hiroshima & Nagasaki Remembrance Event

On August 6th, 2024, Oregon PSR worked with an incredible group of organizations to host a moving remembrance to mark the 79th anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. We are proud to share that the event had over 170 community members coming together to honor the memory of those affected and to reflect on the enduring importance of peace. This year's event was in memory of Carol Urner, who served on our Peace Work Group and helped organize the earliest Hiroshima/Nagasaki memorial events in Portland.

We gathered in a community under the shade of the Japanese American Historical Plaza, featuring a rich tapestry of performers, each bringing their unique voice to the evening. With Portland Taiko's moving cello solo to start the night off, our MC Jeff Selby (Director of the City of Portland's Office of Equity and Human Rights) led us through a collection of speeches from local non-profits, original poetry (with a surprise appearance from Oregon's former poet laureate Kim Stafford), traditional Japanese folk dance (Tsubaki Buyo Doukou Kai Dancers), and ended with a striking story from our keynote speaker Michiko Kornhauser, a Hibakusha (atomic bomb survivor). Their words and performances resonated deeply with all in attendance, reminding us of the profound impact of these historical events and the ongoing need to advocate for peace and understanding.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to everyone who participated, as well as to those who attended. Your support is what brought meaning to this annual event, reinforcing our collective commitment to a more peaceful world.

Environmentalists, customers raise concerns over NW Natural hydrogen project

We just found out that NW Natural, the state's largest fossil fuel utility, has begun blending dangerous hydrogen into the gas system without any public outreach or oversight. The utility has started adding hydrogen into the gas mix in Southeast Portland, which increases exposure to health harms and increases safety risks while offering negligible emissions reductions.

While NW Natural claims that this project will help to reduce the climate pollution from its dirty fossil fuels, hydrogen blending is nothing more than a greenwashing project that will endanger the health and wellbeing of Portland residents. And this is not the first time that NW Natural has risked community health and safety in the name of a public relations effort. In 2022, the utility attempted a hydrogen blending pilot in Eugene. This project was put on permanent hold, citing the need for further community engagement due to

strong backlash from the neighborhood association and community partners. Instead of prioritizing public engagement when they began their Portland project, NW Natural decided to sidestep it all together by exploiting regulatory loopholes.

We need your help to demand that lawmakers stop this risky project until regulatory measures can be put in place. Taking action by customizing and sending this letter takes a few minutes and will let local leaders know we need them to protect our health and safety, and hold NW Natural accountable!

No Nuclear Waste in our Communities!

On May 30, the U.S. Department of Energy (Energy), Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) announced a set of public meetings (in Richland, WA, Olympia, WA, & Hood River, OR) and opened a 90-day public comment period regarding changes to Hanford cleanup. A four year closed door negotiation resulted in a "holistic"

settlement agreement (the settlement) between the agencies. **The negotiations** did not include **Tribal Nations**, nor the public.

The settlement's proposed changes to clean up will alter treatment, storage, and disposal plans for highly toxic and radioactive waste currently stored in aging tanks and the soil beneath them. The most radioactive, toxic waste from this process is stored in Hanford's 177 underground storage tanks, legally classified as high-level waste. Under the law high-level waste must be turned into glass and buried in a deep geological repository. The settlement seemingly changes this plan.

There have been major changes to the Hanford cleanup and timeline. This includes: a new proposal for high-level tank waste treatment, the shipment of tank waste to other communities in Utah and/or Texas, and radioactive waste shipments through Oregon and Washington communities. We are also being asked to accept the principle that it is okay to turn tank waste into grout rather than glass, a major departure from the law and Washington's "as good as glass" principle for immobilizing highly radioactive waste.

Gas 101 Workshop Recap

In early August, Oregon PSR helped organize a "Gas 101" workshop in partnership with the Build/Shift Coalition. Our Healthy Climate Program Director gave a brief presentation about gas, the risks that oil and gas infrastructure and transportation pose to human health and the environment, and the greenwashing tactics practiced by for-profit gas corporations advertising false climate solutions as "clean energy". Jaycob Padron, Senior Program Specialist at Multnomah County, spoke about the health harms of gas stoves and harm reduction strategies to protect your health from the negative health impacts of gas stoves. Over 20 community members attended and expressed interest in learning more about the upcoming Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) rebates.
