JOINT APPEAL




## Oregon PSR is endorsing the Joint Appeal for Nuclear Abolition Day.

Oregon Physicians for Social Responsibility is proud to endorse the joint appeal for Nuclear Abolition Day. The joint appeal urges governments to mark September 26 — the International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons (also known as Nuclear Abolition Day) and the UN High-Level Meeting on the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons — by announcing real plans to prevent nuclear war, move funds from weapons to peace, protect the climate, and meet human needs as promised under Article 26 of the UN Charter.

September 26 is also the 42nd anniversary of Stanislav Petrov's decision to treat as a false alarm early-warning satellite data which incorrectly indicated five incoming ICBMs. Despite having no evidence of the error at the time, Petrov's judgment prevented what likely would have been the launching of a nuclear counterattack. This is just one of many examples of false alarms and close calls that highlight why we must abolish nuclear weapons.

If you're attending, we hope you'll stop by our table—we'd love to see you there!


