Leslie Lookout Park Update

Construction continues on the Leslie Lookout Park, a 1.9 acre open space that will be located on the Martin Goodman Trail at the entrance to Tommy Thompson Park.

Revitalizing this underutilized land will bring this site back into public use, beautify the landscape and complement the natural heritage system of the Port Lands, creating a stronger connection between the city and the natural areas south of Unwin Avenue and Tommy Thompson Park.

Badgerow Parkette Now Complete

Construction on the long-awaited Badgerow Parkette was completed last fall.

The new parkette pays homage to Carlaw Avenue north of Queen Street, the main artery of a busy industrial area for most of the 20th Century. Celebrating the rich industrial history underpinned every aspect of the initiative and inspired all of the designs.

The Badgerow Parkette project emerged from the city's Carlaw + Dundas Community Initiative, which was created to establish a vision for the neighbourhood and identify public realm improvements.



Leslie Street Spit: Better Enforcement for Natural Environment

After my request to the city in 2021, Toronto Region Conservation Authority and City staff continue to enforce rules that protect the wildlife and sensitive ecosystems located in the Leslie Street Spit.

Staff engagement with dog owners, E-vehicle users and other visitors has helped to limit improper activity and protect this pristine, ecologically-sensitive area.



First meeting of the Ontario Line Subcommittee

Subcommittee on Ontario Line Construction

I joined with my colleagues Councillors Ausma Malik and Chris Moise to start the Subcommittee on Metrolinx's Ontario Line Construction.

This comes in response to concerns from residents and community stakeholders who expressed frustration with the lack of public engagement and communication from Metrolinx about the impacts of their construction on traffic, trees, parks and businesses as they roll out this important new transit infrastructure.



Queen and Carlaw Laneway to be Named After Degrassi Co-Creator Kit Hood

I'm happy to support the proposed renaming of a lane way in Leslieville to honour Kit Hood, co-creator of the television show Degrassi.

In addition to his important contributions to arts and culture in Toronto, Kit continued renting his production company's offices to Woodgreen Community Services and the Red Door Family Shelter after he retired. This helped to ensure vulnerable individuals and families in Ward 14 could continue accessing critical supports.

The Community Crisis
Service (TCCS) Launched
in early 2022, the
Community Crisis Service
(TCCS) delivers alternative,
community-led responses to mental
health calls and wellness checks instead
of the police. Program data shows
TCCS is successfully diverting 78 per
cent of the calls made to the police
about people in crisis and providing
referrals to community resources and
provide other support services to those
experiencing mental health crises.

Standing Up Against Bill 23

The province's Bill 23 allows for development on the Greenbelt, two million acres of protected land that's critical to our environment. It could also prevent the city from requiring developers to replace affordable housing units in new developments. This will accelerate the loss of affordable housing, drive up rents and force people out of Toronto or into our overloaded shelter system.
