First meeting of the Ontario Line Subcommittee

Subcommittee on Ontario Line Construction

I joined with my colleagues Councillors Ausma Malik and Chris Moise to start the Subcommittee on Metrolinx's Ontario Line Construction.

This comes in response to concerns from residents and community stakeholders who expressed frustration with the lack of public engagement and communication from Metrolinx about the impacts of their construction on traffic, trees, parks and businesses as they roll out this important new transit infrastructure.

Don Mount Basketball Courts Refurbishment

Buckets & Borders, a charitable organization who aim to improve communities and bring people together through basketball, has chosen the Don Mount Court in Rivertowne as their inaugural project in Toronto.

Their in-kind donation includes significant improvements to the current basketball court, new backboards and rims and other court amenities. Working with Toronto Community Housing and Parks, Forestry & Recreation staff, they will engage diverse Rivertowne youth in the design and refurbishment of the Don Mount Courts.

Construction is well underway for 26 brand new units, including 17 new and nine replacement units that include two studios, 13 one-bedrooms, nine two-bedrooms and two three-bedroom units.



Waterfront East LRT Extension Update

The city of Toronto, TTC and Waterfront Toronto recently held a public meeting to share the latest on the Waterfront East LRT extension project to extend transit from Union Station to the Port Lands.

The project design team discussed updates on:

- Designs for Segment 1 (Union Station to Queens Quay), Segment 2 (Queens Quay East) and Segment 3 (Cherry Street, Commissioners Street and a new loop in the Port Lands)
- Project phasing and implementation
- The Transit Project Assessment Process, constructability assessment and business case

The Community Crisis
Service (TCCS) Launched
in early 2022, the
Community Crisis Service
(TCCS) delivers alternative,
community-led responses to mental
health calls and wellness checks instead
of the police. Program data shows
TCCS is successfully diverting 78 per
cent of the calls made to the police
about people in crisis and providing
referrals to community resources and
provide other support services to those
experiencing mental health crises.
