

PAT Representative Assembly
August 18, 2025

1. **Meeting** called to order at 9:05 a.m.
2. **Agenda** approved by acclamation. Agenda can be accessed [here](#).
3. **Minutes** from 6/4/25 RA approved by acclamation. Minutes were distributed in representative packets and are stored at the PAT office.
4. President Bonilla **reviewed the PAT RA standing rules** (linked in the slideshow sent to representatives)
5. Jacob Jonas-Clauss **reviewed an announcement on the status of the Multnomah County Pre-school for all program** and the efforts by County Commissioner and former PPS school board member Julia Brim-Edwards to index the program to inflation which could pose a financial crisis for the program as intended. Representatives were encouraged to (and to encourage their building members) to access an action QR code to send an email to their county commissioners asking them halt this effort.
6. **Representatives met in zones for a check in.**

 - a. President Bonilla reviewed work done by the executive board during their August 4-5 retreat, welcomed new members to the executive board, updates to member application form, reviewed the new board of the PAT Political Action Committee, 2024 PAT Survey Results and an update to the structure of RA's for the 2025-2026 school year.
 - i. President Bonilla and Vice-President Chavez will be conducting site visits this week along with staff and representatives are encouraged to reach out if they need help, particularly in setting up meetings with building administrators. Representatives are also encouraged to reach out to the advocacy committee to share issues in order to help PAT identify and address systemic issues and contract concerns.
 - ii. Representatives have been given a QR code with links to updated contract schedule checks including core enrichment and special education.

- iii. Members will be given information later on a forthcoming proposed dues increase in part to ensure PAT has the resources for communications and alongside this will be reaching out for members interested in serving on the communications task force.

8. Vice-President's Report: *Report shared in slides given to representatives.

- a. Vice-President Alisha Chavez reviewed the recent new educator orientation. 60 out of 61 new educators attending the orientation signed their PAT membership card!
- b. 61 schools have already held and submitted their rep elections for the 2025-2026 school year! Remaining sites were encouraged to hold their elections soon.
- c. New committee co-chairs were introduced. Ty Marshall (Legislative), Yaniera Romero (RE), Chris Schweizer (Mem, interim), Ian Mullin (Sub), David Scholten (PAT PAC) and Melissa Blount (CAT Task Force Facilitator), joining returning co-chairs, Kelly Sorg and Maggie Raczek (Adv), Julie Whitaker and Ron Morgan (SJCO), Julie Toone (Barg), Samara Bockelman (RE), Geoff Stonecipher and Valerie Turner (IPD/IPC), Jacob Jonas-Closs (Leg), Alien Tran (N&E) and Dustin Starke (Sub).
- d. Representatives were given the updated executive board zone contact list.

9. Secretary's Report:

- a. Brian Halberg reviewed recent actions taken by the PAT Executive Board. In addition to the appointment of new co-chairs (see Vice-President's report above), the executive board approved the 2025-2026 PAT calendar, tasked the nominations and elections committee with creating a process for bargaining team elections and awarded \$1,000 to help offset the cost of an International Migrant Alliance upcoming event at McDaniel High School.
- b. Per the PAT by-laws, Secretary Halberg shared that with 104 voting members present at the RA, the quorum for the RA to conduct business during the 2025-2026 school year will be 53 members.

10. Treasurer's Report:

- a. Treasurer Tina Lamanna reviewed PAT by-laws regarding representatives roles as stewards of member resources, the current financial status of PAT accounts and the process for members to contact the treasurer (PATtreasurer@oregoned.org).

11. Community Report:

- a. OEA Coalition organizer Joanne Sheppard reviewed work done in creating and growing the Oregon Rising Labor coalition, an upcoming migrant defense action on labor day at the Northwest Detention Center in Tacoma, WA organized by IMA-USA, La Resistencia and the Tanggol Migrante Movement and how to connect and work with the Oregon Community Alliance of Tenants.
