## NDP PROPOSED BUDGET MEASURES TO TARGET INEQUALITY

We've been hearing from Canadians who are being told the economy is working but are not feeling the benefits. Instead they see a set of rules stacked against them, designed to further enrich the few at the top. Budget 2018 was an opportunity to put the needs of everyday Canadians ahead of the wealthy and well-connected.

What could have been in this budget implementation act and should have been in the 2018 budget? NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh and I wrote to Prime Minister Trudeau and Finance Minister Bill Morneau to give them direction as to what should have been included in this budget, like targeting the growing inequality between the wealthiest and everyone else, closing tax loopholes for the super-rich, and investing the recovered revenue to lower the cost of prescriptions medicine for all Canadians.


One of the most important items was tackling what is a profoundly unfair tax system. We identified $\$ 3.5$ billion that can be recovered by eliminating the CEO stock option loophole and ending the capital gains exemption used by the mega rich. The federal government would have at least $\$ 10$ billion more if it cracks down on the use of international tax havens.

Jagmeet Singh and I called on the government to invest the revenue from closing the loophole into a universal pharmacare program to battle the increasing cost of pharmaceuticals in Canada as well as speed up spending on affordable housing and provide relief to First Nation communities.

Additionally, we called for amendments to bankruptcy laws to protect workers and pensioners like the thousands affected by Sears Canada's closure. Seniors are cutting their pills in half because they can't afford their prescriptions, workers are having their pensions gutted due to corporate greed and there are still more than a hundred First Nations under boil water advisories.

That was the context of the 2018 federal budget, the context that the Trudeau government should have paid close attention to.


Peter at a press conference with members of the Health Committee speak on their report which repudiated Finance Minister Bill Morneau's refusal of single-payer universal pharmacare program. It's time to act! Canadians would save \$4billion+ a yr. Makes sense given this quiet crisis in Canada where 1 in 5 Canadians aren't able to get their prescription medication!


Nowhere in the 2018 liberal budget does the government address housing, equality, or climate change in B.C.. Instead, the Liberals tabled the largest and most fundamentally anti-democratic omnibus piece of legislation in Canadian history, 100 pages beyond anything Mr. Harper did.
Budgets are about choices and unfortunately the Liberals have chosen tax breaks for wealthy CEOs and giveaways to large corporations over helping our seniors, our families and Indigenous children. It is profoundly cynical as a budget because it goes far below where the budget was, which was already very timid, so we are looking at an extremely timid budget implementation act in terms of what it seeks to achieve. At the same time, it is fundamentally anti-democratic in the size of what has been dumped into this omnibus legislation.

Instead of closing down on loopholes for the super-rich and making real investments in affordable housing and in the environment, the Liberals chose to further delay implementing those measures. Canadians everywhere are worried about the high cost of housing. While the federal government recognizes that there is a housing crisis, it is choosing to wait two years before addressing it.

There is no time to wait, it's time to act. Housing prices, rent, and the number of homeless are at levels beyond belief. Twenty eight per cent of British Columbians pay far too much for housing, which eats away at their budget for food, medication, clothing and transportation.


Over 40 years ago, and again in 2016, the Liberals promised pay equity; no such legislation has been tabled in Parliament. Budget 2018 was an opportunity for the Trudeau government to finally take action to tackle inequality instead of just talking about feminism \& women's equality without action. There is no funding for universal, accessible childcare or improved employment insurance requirements that do not discriminate against women. Recognizing that many of these challenges are faced even more prominently by racialized and Indigenous women, it is clear that Budget 2018 fails to address some of the most systemic issues that contribute to gender inequality, as well as other inequalities in Canada. I helped write a letter to the finance minister with NDP Critic for Women's Equality, Sheila Malcolmson, MP for Nanaimo Ladysmith, (above with NDP Deputy Critic for Women's Equality, Anne Minh-Thu Quach, MP (Salaberry - Suroît) where we pressed the need for action on gender equality.

In addition to these realities Finance Minister Morneau will stand in the House and talk about how things are rosy, but the jobs being created are temporary and precarious. They do not allow for the family-sustaining type of employment that the NDP has always promoted and that we believe very strongly in achieving. However, that takes investments, forethought and planning, which we have not seen from the government.

New Democrats will continue to work hard for a better budget for all Canadians, First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples
