Council Tax Refund

The Council Tax Refund scheme will pay **eligible households £150** to help with the rising cost of living. If you pay council tax on a property, and this is your main home and you are in band A - D, you should have received a payment of £150 by **30 September 2022.**

Support is also available if you live in council tax band E – H and have special circumstances, including:

- If you are a **student** (except if you live in a house of multiple occupation for council tax purposes)
- If you are **under 18** years of age
- If you have a severe **mental impairment**
- If you have an **annex** that a dependent relative lives in

If the Council already has your bank details for paying council tax, and you meet the eligibility criteria, the cost of living payment of £150 will be automatically paid directly into your bank account. You don't need to apply for it.

If you do not pay your council tax by Direct Debit, and you meet the criteria for the scheme, **a letter will be sent to you** and you will have to visit your local Post Office to collect the payment.

Energy Bill Assistance Scheme

The Energy Bill Assistance Scheme will provide eligible households with **a £400 discount** to help with energy bills from October onwards. You don't need to do anything to get the money and you won't have to pay it back.

You will receive the £400 in **6 installments starting from October 2022**. You should receive £66 in October and November and £67 in December, January, February and March. How you get the discount depends on how you pay for energy.

You will receive the discount monthly, even if you pay for your energy every quarter or use a payment card.

Winter Fuel Assistance Scheme

Eligible households can claim **a one-off £200 payment** from the Local Authority to provide support towards paying your fuel costs. This payment is in addition to the Energy Bill rebate being offered by the UK Government and the Winter Fuel Payment normally paid to pensioners. The payment will be available to all eligible households (one payment per household) however you pay for your fuel.

If you receive Council Tax Reduction between 1/9/2022 and 31/1/2023, you meet the criteria for the scheme, **and you do not need to do anything further.**

If your household does NOT receive Council Tax Reduction, but you think you are eligible for a payment under this Scheme, you can apply using an online form.

Warm Homes Discount Scheme

The Warm Homes Discount Scheme gives eligible households a discount on electricity bills. The money is not paid to you - it is a one-off reduction on your electricity bill, between October and March. Those eligible to receive this discount:

- receive a Guaranteed Credit Component of Pension Credit
- are on a low income and meet their energy supplier's criteria for the scheme

Most eligible households will **automatically** receive a discount. You will receive a letter between November 2022 and January 2023 notifying you of the discount if you are eligible. Your letter will say whether you need to call a helpline by 28 February 2023 to confirm your details.

Cold Weather Payment

You may be able to claim the Cold Weather Payment if you are in receipt of **certain benefits** or Mortgage Interest Help.

You will receive a payment if the average temperature in your area has been or is predicted to be zero degrees celsius or less for 7 consecutive days. You will receive a payment of £25 for each period of 7 days of very cold weather between 1 November and 31 March. You don't have to apply - if you're eligible for Cold Weather Payment, you'll be paid automatically.

Winter Fuel Payment

If you were born on or before **25 September 1956** you could get between **£250 and £600** to help you pay your heating bills.

The amount you'll get includes a 'Pensioner Cost of Living Payment'. This is between £150 and £300. You'll only get this extra amount in winter 2022 to 2023. This is in addition to any Cost of Living Payment you get with your benefit or tax credits.

You will receive your Winter Fuel Payment automatically (you don't have to apply) if you are eligible and you:

- receive the State Pension
- are in receipt of another social security benefit (excluding Scottish Government Adult Disability Payment, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, Child Benefit or Universal Credit)

Most payments are made automatically in November and December. **You should be paid by 13 January 2023.**

If you believe you should have received any of these payments but have not, then please contact us.

Energy and Water

If you are having trouble paying for energy or water, **contact your supplier to discuss your situation.** They should be able to advise you and arrange an affordable payment plan if you are struggling to afford your bills.

Fuel Vouchers

You can ask **Gwynedd Council** or **the local food bank** for a fuel voucher. You will receive a code in a letter, text message or email. The code can be used in a PayPoint shop, a Payzone shop or the Post Office to add credit to your gas card or electricity key.

Tell your supplier if you need extra support

Your supplier must treat you fairly and take your situation into account. Make sure they know about anything that might make it harder for you to make payments. For example, notify them if you or a member of your household:

- are disabled
- suffer from a long-term illness
- are above **state pension age**
- have **young children** living with you
- have **financial problems** for example if you are behind on your rent

Ask whether you can be put on your supplier's priority services register.

Priority Services Register

The Priority Services Register is **a free support service** to help vulnerable people. Energy suppliers and network operators offer it.

You are eligible if you:

- are eligible for **State pension**
- are disabled, have a long-term medical condition, or are recovering from an injury
- have a hearing, sight or mental health condition
- are pregnant or have children under 5 years of age
- have additional communication needs

Apply by contacting your energy supplier or network operator.

British Gas Energy Trust

The British Gas Energy Trust will consider grant applications from anyone, regardless of who your energy supplier is.

Scams are on the rise, particularly scams relating to energy discounts and Government energy bill payments.

Scammers have different ways of getting hold of personal information or bank details. For example, by:

- pretending to be a supplier offering a refund
- pretending to be Ofgem requesting information in order to administer the £400 energy rebate
- pretending to be a debt collector asking for money owed to a supplier that has gone out of business
- offering green home improvement grants
- offer investment opportunities in energy
- offer additional keys or cards for a cheap prepaid meter
- offer energy saving devices

Do not disclose personal details

Be careful! Never give out any personal or financial information (such as your bank account details or your PIN) over the phone, even if the person claims to be contacting from the bank. Hang up, and call the company they claim to represent to check if it's a scam. Report scam calls to Action Fraud.



It's important to act as soon as possible if you are struggling to pay your rent, pay bills or make mortgage repayments or other loans. Advice is available to help you deal with debt and early action will ensure things are resolved as quickly as possible.
