Thanks to the cooperation agreement between Plaid Cymru and the Welsh Government, there is currently an ongoing consultation on the proposals that will form the basis of the Welsh Language Education Bill.

The announcement that the Treherbert to Pontypridd line will close for eight months, from 29 April 2023 to early 2024, as part of the South Wales Metro works, is likely to cause concern for many residents living in the Rhondda.

While the investment and improvements to the line are welcomed, many residents rely on the train to access services and go to school, college or work, and don't have alternative ways to travel.

As works commence, I will continue to monitor the situation closely and raise any issues that arise directly with Transport for Wales and the Welsh Government.


Over £14 million secured for flood and coastal erosion risk management programmes in



South Wales Central

As a result of the Cooperation Agreement between Plaid Cymru and the Welsh Government, a £75m funding package to reduce the risk of flooding and coastal erosion for 2023-24 was recently announced.

Of the £75m, over £14m has been secured for projects across South Wales Central which includes over £3.4m for projects in Rhondda Cynon Taf, £5m for projects in Cardiff and £5.7m for projects in the Vale of Glamorgan.



The investment comes as increased flooding due to climate change poses a significant threat to Welsh homes and businesses. Plaid Cymru has been calling for an increase in funding for flood prevention, arguing that it should be a national priority given the frequency and severity of flooding events.

I am so pleased that Plaid Cymru has secured the biggest ever investment in flood defence and mitigation schemes through the Cooperation Agreement. With the increasing frequency of severe flooding events due to climate change, this investment will be crucial in mitigating the impact of flooding on homes and businesses from future flooding through major schemes, such as the one announced for Dinas Powys and many different parts of RCT. However, as we know further investment will also be required and I will continue to fight for all communities who continue to live in fear of flooding.



Exciting news! As of this term, thousands more primary school pupils in South Wales Central will receive free school meals thanks to Plaid Cymru's Cooperation Agreement with Welsh Government as the roll-out continues. I had the pleasure of visiting Ysgol Isaf Gymraeg Garth Olwg during a busy lunchtime to see how pupils are benefiting from free school meals. It was great to see so many more pupils enjoying a nutritious meal.

No child should have to go hungry, and we believe that free school meals are a crucial step towards addressing child poverty. Let's give our children the best start to life by ensuring they have access to a nutritious meal at school.



The Welsh language belongs

to all of us

A recently published white paper setting out proposals for a Welsh Language Education Bill has been published with input from Plaid Cymru as part of the Co-Operation agreement.

The proposals take Wales further towards ensuring the education system delivers Welsh to all pupils in a way that creates confident speakers and one where Welsh medium provision is "normalised" within our schools and communities.

These proposals set out a foundation towards an education system that delivers Welsh medium education to all pupils. They include more Welsh medium schools, an increase in Welsh medium education in every school in Wales and ensuring that every child will leave school as a confident Welsh speaker by 2050.

This comes following the decision to open a new English medium school in an area which is losing a Welsh school. I'm continuing to work with local campaigners and will continue to hold the Welsh Government to account on this decision. Continuing as we are will not safeguard the future of the Welsh Language.









Last week, I spent three days in Dublin as part of the Culture, Welsh Language, Communications, Sport and International Affairs Committee inquiry into the relationship between Wales and Ireland.

It was an interesting and varied visit, and included meeting with members of the Oireachtas where we discussed common areas of interest and potential collaboration. The relationship between both of our nations has always been a close one, but has obviously taken on a further significance since Brexit.
