This newsletter is an opportunity to update you on my work and some of the issues I have been raising in the Senedd and across the region over the past two months.

The cost-of-living crisis continues to be a key focus of the office. Myself and my team have been supporting residents with funding as well as finding practical ways we can support local foodbanks and organisations who are working on the frontline. The team has continued to work on the issue of flooding and has prepared a flood advice booklet for residence.

Some of the key issues I have been raising on behalf of constituents this past month in the Senedd have been hospital waiting times, women's health, support for families impacted by the cost-of-living crisis, lack of school places for children arriving to Wales from the Ukraine as well as continuing to raise the issue of flooding.



Over the past couple of months, myself and my team have been meeting with a number of constituents and community groups across the region. One highlight was visiting Goldsland Farm in the Vale of Glamorgan to meet with local farmers as well as plant a tree as part of NFU's growing together campaign. I was also lucky enough to take part in the Ramadan celebrations at Dar UI-Isra mosque in Cathays where I was able to learn more about what the Muslim community have been doing across the region.

I recently held a public meeting with residents in Church Village who were concerned with speeding in their area.

I am aware this is not an issue unique to this area with many concerned constituents contacting my office about similar issues.

Supporting

Flooded

Communities

Over there past few months there has been progress made in tackling the issue of flooding across the region. As part of the co-operation agreement Welsh Government have agreed to an independent review of the floods that happened in 2020. The terms of reference for the review should be announced soon and then I will begin collecting evidence from residents who were affected across the region to contribute to the review.

In addition to this, I had the opportunity to hold a short debate in the Senedd on the topic of supporting communities at risk of continuous risk of flooding: Is it time to establish a Welsh Flood forum? I'm pleased to announce that there was cross party support on the need to establish better support for at risk communities and establish a Welsh Flood Forum will be looked at closely as part of the independent flood review.

My team and I have also created and been out distributing Flood Advice booklets to residents who live in high-risk areas. A copy is also available online for those who wish to download it and use it to prepare for future flooding.



Local foodbanks across the region are in desperate need of more donations. I recently went to visit the local foodbank in Pontypridd to meet with volunteers and see how my office can support them.

We have now set up a donation point in the office in Pontypridd If you are able to help, you can drop off any donations during office hours and we will take them to the local food bank. Thanks to everyone that has donated already your generosity is deeply appreciated.

If you are in need of support our local foodbanks are welcoming and non-judgmental. I know it can be difficult asking for support, but you are not alone, and help is available.



The cost of living crisis continues to be a key issue for many residents. You may remember back in February we invited local organisation from all across the region to discuss practical ways we can work together to support local people.

Following the summit my team and I have produced a report setting out our key priorities in tackling this crisis which include:

- Identifying ways for services to work together to support those in need in our communities.
- Develop community initiatives to support people with the rising cost of living.
- Increase financial support for organisation tackling the cost of living.
- Working together with organisations to put pressure on UK government to do more to intervene.

I had the opportunity to raise a number of the different issues that constituents have contacted me on in the Senedd over the last few months. Recently, I was contacted by a concered constituent who had been told her surgery to treat her endometriosis was cancelled two years after her planned surgery because of Lockdown. Since raising this issue in the Senedd my constituent has been offered an appointment.

Sadly, she isn't alone in this, and I have heard many distressing stories from women across the region. It's totally unacceptable that anyone has had to experience this.

The state of Women's health in Wales has been one many health issues that has been labelled as non - urgent during the pandemic. I raised this issue with the minister and am pleased that the government has put a plan in place to address this issue with a further plan to address women's health issues specifically planned to be released later in the year.

Welsh covid inquiry

It's clear from all of the heart-breaking stories by everyone who lost loved ones during the pandemics they do not trust the prime minister to lead a proper inquiry into covid. I raised this with the first minister who has been very vocal about his mistrust in the Prime Minister it was disappoint to hear that the first minister still refuses to support a Welsh Covid Inquiry.



To date 10,082 people in Wales have died as a result of covid and I strongly believe that we should be following the Scottish governments lead of having our own inquiry here in Wales while also contributing to the wider UK one. I will continue to raise these concerns in the Senedd.



Over the past few months, I have heard from many distressed constituents who have been hit with the rising cost of living having to face the difficult decision of choosing to feed themselves or their pets. There currently is little support for pet owners to help with these costs which has led to a worrying amount of pet owners being faced with the decision of having to give up their pets.

This is a decision no one should have to make. Our pets are an important part of our families and not enough is being done to support pet owners. I recently raised this issue in the Senedd with the Minister for Rural Affairs and currently there are no direct plans to support pet owners, but I hope the government considers future support.


If you are struggling with pet costs, please know help is often available through your local food bank — don't be afraid to ask.

Homes for Ukraine

We have all seen the devastating images coming out of Ukraine since Russia invaded the country back in February. Me and my Plaid Cymru colleagues have been vocal in the Senedd about the need for Wales to do their part in supporting Ukraine and the refugees who are coming to Wales.

Over the past few months my office has been supporting constituents and will continue to support those who have signed up to the homes for Ukraine scheme as well as common issues that have risen such as lack of school places for children coming to Wales in the Senedd.
