


Recent Club Events



It's Political!

The Senate Needs to Stay Blue: Vote for Angela Alsobrooks in Maryland

In July 2024, the U.S. Supreme Court vastly expanded the power of the President of the United States. According to the ruling of the six Republican-appointed Justices, "the nature of Presidential power requires that a former President have some immunity from criminal prosecution for official acts during his tenure in office. At least with respect to the President's exercise of his core constitutional powers, this immunity must be absolute." The Court went on to state that "[a]s for his remaining official actions, he is also entitled to immunity. At the current stage of proceedings in this case, however, we need not and do not decide whether that immunity must be absolute, or instead whether a presumptive immunity is sufficient." 23-939 Trump v. United States (07/01/2024) (supremecourt.gov).

Dissenting Justices Sotomayor, Kagan and Jackson were blunt in their assessment of the majority holding, stating that the "decision to grant former Presidents criminal immunity reshapes the institution of the Presidency. It makes a mockery of the principle, foundational to our Constitution and system of Government, that no man is above the law." Not holding back, the dissenting Justices concluded that the majority holding "will have disastrous consequences for the Presidency and for our democracy." https://www.supremecourt.gov/opinions/23pdf/23-939_e2pg.pdf.

While the full ramifications of the Supreme Court's decision may only be known to future generations, what is known now is that there is little meaningful check on a President's enormous powers. One of the few remaining checks may be the Senate of the United States Congress. Under Article II, Section II of the U.S. Constitution, the President cannot appoint cabinet members and Justices of the Supreme Court without the consent of the Senate. The Constitution of the United States: A Transcription I National Archives.

Under various laws currently in place, principal officers of the United States must also have Senate approval. https://www.senate.gov/about/powers-procedures/nominations.htm. In addition, only the Senate has the authority to remove the President from office on impeachment for and conviction of treason, bribery or other high crimes and misdemeanors.

The person elected President in November 2024 will have enormous consequences for both the United States and the rest of the world. It will matter who the next President nominates for the cabinet, especially for Attorney General. Having experienced the reversal of Roe v. Wade, and the grant of absolute immunity to Donald Trump for all his "core" constitutional powers official acts, it will certainly matter who the next President nominates for the next Supreme Court vacancy.

A Republican majority in the Senate would make it hard for a President Harris to govern. Given the history of the Republican majority during the first Trump administration, a possibly elected Trump will rule without boundaries. By contrast, a democratically led Senate would help a President Harris to govern effectively and may well be the only check in a second Trump Administration.

Former Governor Hogan is running ads emphasizing his independent approach, his desire to "fix" broken politics, and his desire to find "common ground." https://larryhogan.com/why-im-running/. But likeability, personal history, and advertisements do not really matter. Mr. Hogan will vote with his Republican colleagues.

What does matter is to vote and to vote strategically. Only a Senator Alsobrooks will help keep the Senate in Democratic hands, and only a Democratically-led Senate will serve its constitutional purpose.
