

It's Political!

Keep the Senate and Win the House

In this election cycle so much attention is focused on the presidential race. But one cannot overstate how crucial it is that Democrats hold the Senate and regain the majority in the House of Representatives. It is the Congress where legislative power is vested and things get done – or not.

The official websites of the current Maryland delegation to the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives tell a lot about who our Congressional representatives are, what their priorities are, what they are thinking and working on, and ultimately, whether they deserve your vote.

Senators Cardin (https://www.vanhollen.senate.gov/ identify what they are doing for Marylanders on an almost daily basis. Their press releases are short and highlight not only votes taken and bills introduced, but also their views on specific matters. For example, over the two-day period from March 20 to March 22, 2024, Senator Van Hollen's press releases: i) explained reintroduced legislation that would expand human rights safeguards; ii) announced funding for planning to improve access to the Aberdeen Train Station; iii) summarized the bill he, Senator Cardin and Senator Tammy Baldwin introduced to make it easier for local governments to access federal funds to improve safety for bicyclists and pedestrians; iv) explained the Senator's call to release funding for food aid to Gaza; v) announced release of the text of the Fiscal Year 2024 Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act and highlighted its key provisions; vi) described the Senator's meeting with Eastern Shore Crab Houses and his efforts to support the seafood industry's employment needs); vii) explained the Senator's efforts along with 17 of his Senate colleagues to

urge President Biden to establish a framework for the U.S. to recognize a non-militarized Palestinian state; and viii) announced with Senator Cardin, \$4.5 Million in funds for improvements on U.S. Route 50 in Easton and Route 113 in Berlin. https://www.vanhollen.senate.gov/news/press-releases

For the same two-day period Senator Cardin's press releases referenced the Route 50/Route 113 infrastructure and bike safety projects, and also noted the reintroduction of bicameral legislation (with Congressman Raskin) that would establish protected status and a pathway to citizenship for stateless individuals living in the U.S. https://www.cardin.senate.gov/press-releases/. Use of the "search" function on Senator Cardin's website allows constituents to access information of particular interest. For example, search results for "Infrastructure Act" referenced multiple infrastructure projects for March 2024. These included i) federal funding for local projects across Baltimore City and County; ii) direct investments for local projects across the Eastern Shore; iii) direct investments for Anne Arundel and Southern Maryland; iv) direct investments for Western Maryland, and v) funding for restoring connections for West Baltimore communities to Druid Hill Park. https://www.cardin.senate.gov/?s=infrastructure+act+projects

Each member of the Maryland Delegation to the House of Representatives has a website. Representative Jamie Raskin has an informative site.

https://raskin.house.gov/about His month of March press releases included not only a virtual IRS information session for the 2024 season, but also identified funding secured for a range of projects and statements on a variety of issues.

Representative David Trone, running for Senator Cardin's seat, has a press site that demonstrates his focus on a range of matters.

His March 2024 press releases describe: i) the Congressman's launch of a reproductive rights resource to combat nationwide attacks on reproductive freedoms; ii) his efforts to secure community project funding, increases in funding for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children as well as funding for mifepristone access; iii) passage of the End Fentanyl Act in the House that he introduced together with a Republican colleague from Mississippi; iv) the Congressman's efforts to secure criminal justice initiatives in the FY24 Government funding package; and v) efforts to secure strong labor standards for companies receiving CHIPs and Science Act_funds.

Democratic Maryland Congressional Representatives Glenn Ivey https://ivey.house.gov/media; John Sarbaneshttps://sarbanes.house.gov/media-center/press-releases; Steny Hoyerhttps://media-press-releases; and Dutch Ruppersbergerhttps://ruppersberger.house.gov/news-room/press-releases each have their own websites. The websites illustrate the representatives' interests and priorities and are worth a look.

Maryland's Republican Congressman Harris also has a website. https://harris.house.gov/media His press releases for March include: i) a statement regarding his vote to require ByteDance to divest ownership in TikTok in order to continue operating in the U.S.; ii) a report of his demand that the

Department of Health and Human Services provide answers on how the Medical Marijuana and Cannabidiol Research Expansion Act is being implemented together with a link to his letter to the agency; iii) a statement expressing pleasure that the Senate "passed language included at [his] direction" to help contain and market invasive blue catfish in the Bay, iv) announcement of the launch of the 2024 Congressional Art Competition; and v) announcement on March 4 of two telephone town halls, one to be held March 5 and the other on March 7.

The websites of our congressional representatives are a tell. And the tell is clear - Democrats get things done. Democrats need to hold the Senate and regain the House
