Reasons to Vote Democratic Up and Down the Ticket

Here are some reasons to vote Democratic up and down the ticket in November and some suggestions for summer reading that might be clarifying:

America's future. For a short summary of what is at stake, look at Ken Burns' address to the 2024 graduates of Brandeis University. You can read his speech on the Brandeis University website

The most chilling passage in Ken Burns' address may be this: "There is no real choice this November. There is only the perpetuation, however flawed and feeble you might perceive it, of our fragile 249-year-old experiment or the entropy that will engulf and destroy us if we take the other route. When, as Mercy Otis Warren would say, "The checks of conscience are thrown aside and a deformed picture of the soul is revealed." The presumptive Republican nominee is the opioid of all opioids, an easy cure for what some believe is the solution to our myriad pains and problems. When in fact with him, you end up re-enslaved with an even bigger problem, a worse affliction and addiction, "a bigger delusion", James Baldwin would say, the author and finisher of our national existence, our national suicide as Mr. Lincoln prophesies. Do not be seduced by easy equalization. There is nothing equal about this equation. We are at an existential crossroads in our political and civic lives. This is a choice that could not be clearer."

1. **The Supreme Court**. The next President will choose the next Supreme Court Justice. The Senate will confirm or reject the Justice the President names. At this time the appointment to the Court is for the life of the Justice, and each Justice largely determines whether he or she can fairly sit in judgment. Term limits, an enforceable code of conduct, and clear lines as to when a Justice must recuse himself/herself from participating in a matter might be straightforward mechanisms to assure that the court, as Justice Amy Coney Barrett stated, is not composed of a bunch of partisan hacks. https://www.cnn.com/2021/09/13/politics/amy-coney-barrett-supreme-courtnot-partisan/index.html. Given the recent Supreme Court decision to overturn reproductive rights that had been protected under Roe v. Wade for fifty years, and the decisions of Justices Thomas and Alito to not recuse themselves from hearing cases when questions regarding their impartiality are widespread, it can be hard to conclude now that there is no partisan bias at the court. For a short summary of what is wrong and what can be done, see the recent suggestions of Maryland's own Congressman from the 8th Congressional District, Representative Jamie Raskin.
