

Grassroots Neighborhood Effort

Marsha and Scott Peters (Dem Club members and Four Seasons residents) organized a Nebraska postcard writing session on August 21st at the Kent Island Public Library. They purchased 2,000 postcards from the Blue Wave Postcard Movement. Over 20 people showed up to pitch in and write.



Why Nebraska?

- Nebraska's one competitive Electoral College vote may be the deciding vote for the EC outcome if the presidential election is extremely close.
- Nebraska has one competitive House race —in the same district as the Electoral College vote.
- Nebraska has a competitive U.S. Senate race between an independent candidate, Dan Osborn, and the incumbent Republican Senator Deb Fischer, who is very unpopular. Deb Fischer votes with Mitch McConnell more than 90% of the time. No Democrat is running in the race.

From the Blue Wave Postcard Movement:

Nebraska is perhaps the most likely state on the 2024 Senate map where an incumbent Republican Senator could be defeated. Most public polls have shown that Osborn is neck-and-neck with Fischer, with many voters still undecided. Polls indicate that Osborn lacks name recognition in the state—he has never run for public office before —while Fischer is much better known (and unpopular). When voters learn who Dan Osborn is and what he stands for, they are far more likely to vote for him than Fischer.

The Blue Wave Postcard Movement is the only campaign reaching out widely to left-leaning and independent Nebraskans and informing them about Dan Osborn. Nebraska is worth the effort, and this could be their most impactful campaign yet.




Day of Action ("Do Something!") - Sept. 8th

Do Something this Election Year: Vote Democratic Up and Down the Ballot

What gets lost in the discussion of the 2025 agenda is the record of what a Democratic House in 2020-2022 and a Democratic Senate and a Democratic President during 2020 - 2024 accomplished to move America forward.

During the last four years, the Biden Administration and Democrats in the Congress provided the funds and support that help people and business in their day-to- day work and everyday lives in a real and tangible way. You can see this most directly in the way the Federal Government spends its money. In Maryland, for example, total federal spending was this:

In Maryland, the federal government did not just spend money on Social Security payments, pension payments, VA benefits, Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement and agricultural support: there were also investments in the Eastern Shore itself. Democratic Senators Van Hollen and Cardin helped secure \$32,537,200 in direct federal funding for local projects across the Eastern Shore within the six-bill package of fiscal year 2024. These funds support projects that encompass a wide array of local priorities for Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Harford, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico and Worcester Counties ranging from public safety and infrastructure improvement to environment and workforce development. https://www.cardin.senate.gov/press-releases/cardin-van-hollen-announce-over-30-million-in-direct-investments-for-eastern-shore-in-senate-passed-fy24-funding-package/

As important as protecting fundamental rights, and funding legislative priorities, a Democratic President and a Democratic Congress could determine whether changes should be made to the functioning of the U.S. Supreme Court such as term limits or an enforceable code of ethics. Absent changes, the Court's recent decisions to restrict reproductive rights, curb environmental protections, weaken the exercise of agency expertise in crafting regulations, and grant of immunity from criminal prosecution to the President for "official" acts may be only a harbinger of things to come.

This election is crucial and the record could not be clearer: The people of Maryland benefit from a Democratic President, Senate and House of Representatives.
