
Please mark your calendars for the third Wednesday of every month (excluding summer) for our Hot Topic membership meetings. We are also very open to recommendations.

Action Group Met on January 7th and 9th

The Action Group met twice, Jan. 7 and Jan. 9, to kick off the group. In both of those meetings, we discussed a variety of actions to prioritize at both the national and local levels. Regarding Andy Harris, we discussed trolling him on Facebook (including naming our effort "Where's Andy"), writing letters, and making phone calls to ask him to vote in particular ways, monitoring his newsletter and website, writing short pieces for local media on how his votes hurt his constituents and our community, and asking him for town hall meetings. The main point of all of this is to alert the community early in the cycle that what he does hasn't been helping them.

On the national level, we are currently writing to our senators about the unacceptability of many of Trump's cabinet nominees, most especially Hegseth, Gabbard, Kennedy, and Patel. One of the main initiatives that we need to begin soon is to identify candidates that we can start introducing to the District 1 (congressional) and District 36 (state) communities, so that we can run them more effectively in 2026. Finally, we are keeping track of social media (BlueSky, Substack, etc) to get information and share when it seems appropriate. We have put together a list of our state and federal representatives and their contact information. People's March on January 18th in DC

QAC Democratic Club Board member, Marti MacKenzie, attended this year's march on January 18th. Her words follow, but note that her finding further reinforces the action-oriented opportunities our Club is underscoring at this time:

It wasn't the hundreds of thousands of people who marched in Washington in 2017, the day after Donald Trump became president the first time, but several thousand did gather Saturday, two days before he was inaugurated the second time. Protestors carried handmade signs, vowing to resist policies impacting climate, reproductive rights, gender issues, gun control, and more. Sponsors and speakers represented Planned Parenthood, ACLU, Sierra Club, and other progressive groups.

I am a frequent attendee of rallies in D.C., and was there for both. Those attending were passionate, loud, and knowledgeable. I met protesters from Colorado, New York, and North Carolina. A friend of mine had driven from Miami to join me and make his voice heard. Still, the hundreds of chartered buses that descended on the city eight years ago were replaced by a few dozen. The Metro wasn't packed, only a few streets were blocked, and park police were present only in small numbers.

The Washington march was the largest of many around the country, including a small gathering in Chestertown. Those opposing Trump have expressed a need to resist in other ways beside large rallies.

We have recently established a working group of members who are interested in specific action-oriented plans to disrupt the Trump agenda. Currently we have about a dozen or so committed folks, and can always use more. We are focusing on Trump's nominees at the moment, but will also be addressing policy issues as they develop.

One of our major projects is to focus on local issues and candidates, and a major goal of this work is to unseat Andy Harris in 2026. Our models of resistance come from the Indivisible Guide, Chop Wood Carry Water, and other action groups. We have had 2 meetings so far, and have been communicating through email.

Where's Andy?

On January 20, 2025, our Congressman, Andy Harris (R), went on Fox Business's Mornings and decried the pardons Joe Biden issued on his final days in office as" unprecedented" and "unfathomable."(1) Andy observed that these pardons, which also apply to law enforcement officers who testified before the January 6 Committee,

interfere with Congress operates.(2)

Andy has not yet commented on President Trump's unprecedented and unfathomable decision on January 21 to pardon all approximately 1,500 individuals convicted or awaiting trial on charges relating to the storming of the United States Capitol on January 6, 2021. Those pardoned included those convicted of seditious conspiracy against the United States and others convicted of attacking and injuring law enforcement officers attempting to protect the Capitol and the Senators and Representatives – like Andy Harris – conducting their ceremonial duties relating to certification of the results of the 2020 election. Approximately 140 police officers were injured in the riot, including those law enforcement officers who testified before the January 6 Committee, where they described the horrific scene at the Capitol as they were attacked by the rioters.

We look forward to Andy condemning Trump's blanket pardons, the horrible precedent they set, and the likelihood that they will encourage others disappointed with the results of an election or other government action to resort to violent measures.

Cecile Richards, Rest in Power



Monday, Jan. 20, was a sad day, not only because of the inauguration of a tyrant to the Presidency, but also because we lost a truly inspiring warrior, Cecile Richards. Cecile was a freedom fighter beginning in adolescence, inspired by both of her parents, Ann and David Richards. She was the President of Planned Parenthood from 2005 to 2018, after which she founded the feminist political action group, Supermajority. Her political activism began with labor organizing, but was really centered on women's issues, especially reproductive freedom, for most of her life. She was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Biden in 2024. Cecile was diagnosed with glioblastoma, an aggressive form of brain cancer in 2023, and succumbed to it on Monday, Jan 20, 2025. Her tireless work inspires all of us to work harder. Cecile Richards will always be on the top 10 list of feminist warriors, and will never be forgotten. Thank you, Cecile. Rest in Power.
