Where's Andy?

Andy is "Present."

Congressman Andy Harris, M.D. (R-MD1) says on his campaign website that he originally decided to run for the Maryland state senate in 1998 because he was "[u]nhappy with the status quo in Annapolis." Without elaborating on what made him unhappy about the Maryland state senate almost 30 years ago, perhaps it was politicians saying one thing and doing another.

If that were one of his reasons, the Andy of 1998 would likely be unhappy with the Andy of 2025. Andy says he hates federal deficits. Despite his claimed aversion to deficits, he supported the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 during the first Trump administration. This legislation *increased* the federal deficit by \$7 trillion.

More recently, Andy initially supported the House budget reconciliation bill, which proposed extending the 2017 tax cuts by another ten years, further adding at least \$3 trillion more to the national debt. To help offset the addition to the federal deficit, the bill as finally negotiated proposes to cut federal spending on programs like Medicaid and food stamps by \$1.5 trillion.

This bill – essentially a reverse "Robin Hood" measure – disproportionately benefits wealthy individuals and affirmatively harms those at the bottom of the economic ladder. As enacted by the House on May 22, the bill would reduce Medicaid funding by roughly \$700 billion, causing approximately 13 million Americans to lose their health care coverage. It would also reduce funding for the Supplemental Nutritional

Assistance Program – commonly known as food stamps – by approximately \$300 billion over 10 years.

Notably, almost 200,000 of Andy's constituents -- almost 25 percent of all residents of the First District – rely on Medicaid. Over 34,000 households in the First District (roughly 11 percent of the total) rely on the SNAP program.

When pressed about why he favors lowering tax rates for the wealthiest Americans despite the long-term increase in the federal deficit by over \$3 trillion, Andy reverts to supply side mumbo jumbo about how lowering taxes would actually increase gross domestic product by \$2.5 trillion over 10 years (as he did at his March 25 telephone town hall).

Republicans have made some version of this argument for roughly 100 years. But whether you call it "trickle down" or "supply side economics," it never delivers the promised benefits. Instead, it makes the rich richer and the deficit larger, all at the expense of the most vulnerable members of society.

Here, it has the potential to harm a substantial number of Andy's constituents. Andy has repeated for months that the budget bill would not cause any reduction in Medicaid funding. He made these statements on the floor of the House, in television interviews, on social media, and during his telephone town halls.

When the final text of the bill was released after all-night sessions of the House Budget Committee and the Rules Committee, Andy came out against the bill. What was the basis of Andy's opposition? Was it the likely effect of these cruel cuts on his constituents?

On the contrary, Andy said he opposed the measure because the cuts in domestic spending – including Medicaid – *were not big enough!* Andy proclaimed before the vote that the bill "not ready for prime time," demanding further cuts to Medicaid funding. Without those changes, said Andy, "I'm still a HARD NO."

On the day of the vote, two Republicans joined all Democrats in opposing the bill, leaving the tally 215-214 in favor of passage. Andy – Mr. HARD NO – had it in his power to tank the bill by voting no.

What did Andy do? He bravely voted ... "Present."

His vote was effectively a vote in favor. He explained in a press release, "I voted to move the bill along in the process for the President. There is still a lot of work to be done in deficit reduction and ending waste, fraud, and abuse in the Medicaid program."

Andy can repeat "waste, fraud and abuse" until the cows come home, but the Republicans have not been able to find any significant fraud in the Medicaid program and the work and paperwork requirements are designed to cause people to lose coverage.

The bill moves on to the Senate, where several Republican senators are objecting to the bill on a variety of reasons seemingly in conflict with one another. But however the Senate vote turns out, Andy's vote allowed it to proceed. In whatever form

Republicans pass this bill and send it to President Trump for his signature, vast numbers of Andy's constituents will suffer.

So much for bucking the status quo.

- Promote public health initiatives that have been rejected by Secretary Kennedy, including encouraging vaccinations
- Reinstate FEMA funding and personnel
- Reclaim Congressional authority, including and especially the allocation of funding
- Prevent the re-opening of Alcatraz
- Protect AMERICAN CITIZENS from deportation
- Restore critical medical research and education
