Membership Meeting April 16th, 2025: Guest Speaker Paul Zeitlin on Tariffs

Our April membership meeting was highly informative and our participants had many comments and questions following Paul Zeitlin's presentation on Tariffs. Paul defined tariffs, and spoke about the financial impact on the individual, our domestic economy, and the global implications resulting from the current administration's actions.





Paul has spent a majority of his career working for Big Five Firms. He led large DoD programs focusing on the budgeting and financial management, including developing annual Presidential Budgets before setting out and opening White Cap Advisory Services (WCAS). White Cap Advisory Services is a financial and project management firm focusing on government, corporate, and individual needs. In 2011,

Paul was appointed to the Queen Anne's County Budget Task Force. The objective of the Task Force was balancing the county's budget during a period of short falls incurred by the county.

Here are some key points made during Paul's presentation:

Financial impact of tariffs on the domestic economy and global implications;

- Primary result most likely is the other country will impose tariffs on U.S. goods, which squeezes U.S. companies profitability
- Countries look for other trading partners or establish new production facilities, which reduces the ability to trade internationally by the U.S.
- May, and has, lead to inflation
- Impacts our relationships with our government beyond the fiscal implications
- May lead to economy slowdown
- Market uncertainty
- Destabilize U.S. economy

Impacts to the individual

- Higher cost on U.S. and foreign made goods (inflation)
- Slowdown of economy means higher prices which causes less demand, and less demand results in less corporate investment, which impacts the stock market
- Unemployment resulting from uncertainty created by both tariffs and the economic slowdown, which impacts the hiring practices of companies

Where's Andy?

What Golden Age?

In late January, Congressman Andy Harris, M.D. (R-MD1) triumphantly reported that he had attended Donald Trump's inauguration. It was held in the Capitol Rotunda due to the frigid outside temperatures. But there was Andy, alongside billionaires Elon Musk, Jeff Bezos, and Mark Zuckerberg, among others, basking in Trump's

reflective glow. Andy proclaimed, "The Golden Age of America begins now."

Now that we have reached the 100-day mark of Trump 2.0, let's see how the Golden Age is going. In a Facebook post on April 29, Andy celebrated the first 100 days of the Trump Administration, specifically citing the changing of the name of the Gulf of Mexico to the "Gulf of America" as a noteworthy achievement. Given that the name "Gulf of Mexico" first appeared on a map in 1550, it is unclear what, if any, benefits will accrue to the United States by insisting that this body of water now be called by another name, particularly one intended to provoke the rest of the world. Indeed, during Andy's telephone town meeting held on April 7, a constituent asked him why Republicans were focusing on renaming the Gulf of Mexico rather than reforming the health care system. Good question. Is renaming the Gulf of Mexico and subjecting the United States to worldwide ridicule part of the Golden Age?

Turning to more substantive matters, Andy's constituents are feeling the pain of Trump's ever-changing tariff pronouncements, which have caused the Dow Jones Industrial Average and the Standard and Poor's 500 index to drop by approximately 7 percent since Trump's inauguration. During Andy's telephone town hall on April 7, 2025, a long-time teacher hoping to retire next year expressed concern that her retirement plan had decreased in value by \$118,000. She asked Andy what the "real plan" was, adding that she did not want to be told that the tariffs would bring manufacturing back to the United States. What did Andy say? "We need to bring industry back." He assured the caller, without elaboration, that the tariffs would "work out best for all Americans." In other words, trust us. Will the teacher recap the benefits of the Golden Age? Or is she merely collateral damage?

Of course, Andy remains all-in on plans to extend and expand the Trump tax cuts for ten more years at a cost to the taxpayers of at least \$4.5 trillion. While wealthy individuals and corporations may reap the benefits of the Golden Age, average Americans – including those residing in Andy's Congressional district – will not. And although Andy denies it, Republicans plan to pay for these tax cuts by slashing at least \$1.5 trillion from federal spending, including \$880 billion from Medicaid alone. As a result, Medicaid recipients, including pregnant women and children, will not likely be enjoying the Golden Age of Trump.

Also during the April 7 telephone town hall, a caller asked Andy if the House still had the "power of the purse," given that the Trump Administration was refusing to spend funds duly appropriated by Congress. Andy assured the caller that the Anti-Impoundment Act of 1974 required the President to either spend the appropriated funds as directed by Congress or present a so-called "recission" bill by September 30. But he did not indicate he had any plans to force the issue. Is Andy's abdication of responsibility part of the Golden Age?

At bottom, anyone who loves and cherishes the Constitutional order of the United States does not see the first 100 days of the Trump Administration as a Golden Age. Through executive orders – signed with the fanfare of royal proclamations – and a refusal to follow the law, the Trump Administration has launched an all-out assault on our system of government and our standing in the world. Andy, a member of the House Appropriations Committee and a subcommittee chairman, should be defending Congress' power of the purse. Instead, he has allowed the Executive Branch to usurp Congress' role with nary a peep.

The real story of the first 100 days of the Trump Administration was best summed up by a constituent who called into Andy's telephone town hall on April 1. She asked Andy how he reconciles the dismantling of the U.S. Agency for International Development, including its programs to end worldwide hunger and to provide vaccines, with his staunch anti-abortion views. She asked him, "Why do you favor one life over another?" After Andy asserted that the United States couldn't afford these programs, the caller reminded him of the benefits of American soft power, and said she could not believe that more Republicans "can't use their own consciences and integrity" to prevent the dismantling of these humanitarian efforts. She concluded: "I used to be proud to be an American. Now I'm ashamed"

Despite Andy's claim that we are entering a Golden Age, history will likely tell a different story of the Trump Administration and Congressional Republicans, like Andy, who have enabled the undoing of the United States government and the world order. Theirs will not be a Golden Age, but one of shame.
