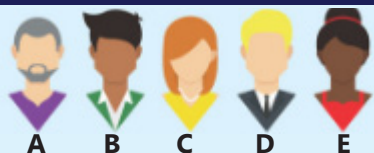


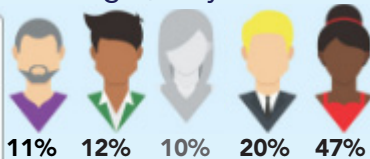
Ranked Choice Voting

How Does it Work?



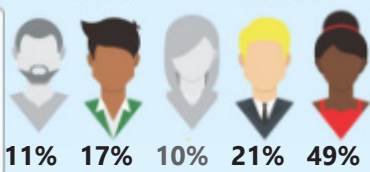
Instead of picking just one candidate, voters rank them by preference. If one candidate earns more than 50% outright, they win.

CITY MAYOR	
5	CANDIDATE A
4	CANDIDATE B
1	CANDIDATE C
3	CANDIDATE D
2	CANDIDATE E

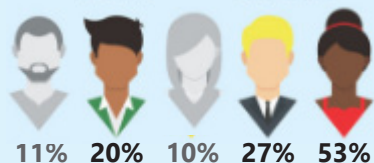


If no candidate secures over 50% of the vote, The last place candidate is eliminated.

CITY MAYOR	
5	CANDIDATE A
4	CANDIDATE B
1	CANDIDATE C
3	CANDIDATE D
2	CANDIDATE E



The second choice votes of their supporters are then distributed among the remaining candidates.



This process continues until a single candidate has more than 50% of the votes.



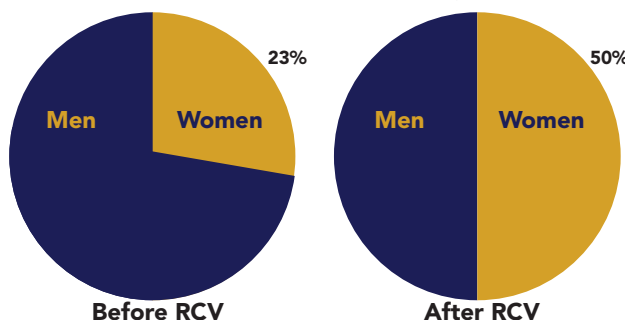
Ranked Choice Voting

What are the Benefits?

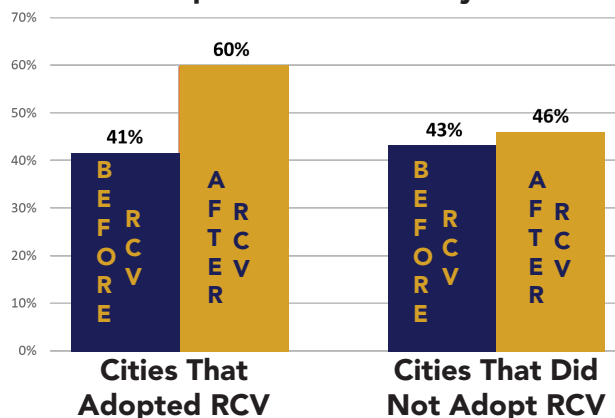
Ranked Choice Voting would provide Hoosiers representation that reflects their local communities.

In a study conducted of cities in the San Francisco Bay Area, it was found that those using Ranked Choice Voting experienced an increase in the ethnic and gender representation of their communities.

Gender Representation on City Councils

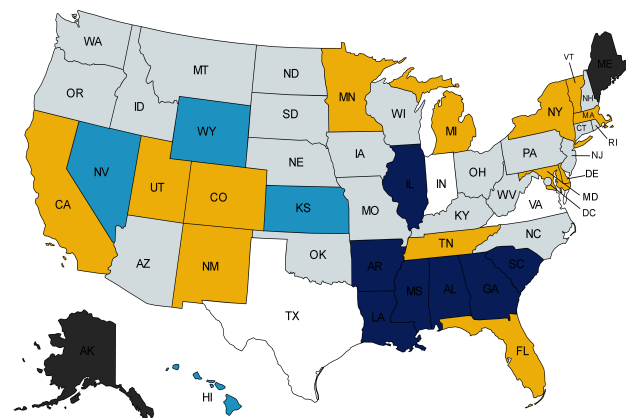


Ethnic Representation on City Councils

Where is it Being Used?



- RCV used statewide for presidential elections
- RCV used for military and overseas voting
- RCV used /enacted for local elections
- RCV used for presidential primaries
- RCV used for party elections

9,287,150 Americans have the ability to use rank choice voting in at least one election in which they participate

RCV is being considered by 29 state legislatures this year alone.



Ranked Choice Voting **Why Do We Need It?**

Our current voting system contributes to many problems:

High voter dissatisfaction

Low turnout

Negative campaigning

"Vote splitting" and "Spoilers"

Limited range of candidates

Lack of community representation

Ranked Choice Voting:

Eliminates spoilers and vote-splitting

Curbs negative campaigning

Increases voter satisfaction

Boosts voting turnout

Widens the range of candidate

Ranked Choice Voting allows voters to rank multiple candidates in the order they prefer.

There are no "spoilers" or "throw away" votes.

Each voter has the same amount of power over election outcomes.

Every vote counts.
