Legislative Happenings

Campaign season is busy for countless reasons, and building your legislative package is one of them! I began working on future legislative ideas and identifying opportunities for solutions and partners as early as August, and the work continues. For me this has meant meeting with professionals across many backgrounds, including renewable energy, child care providers, our cities and towns, housing advocates, UNH, Pease Development Authority, and others!

I am also Chairing the Committee To Study And Make Recommendations Relative To Licensure of Mental Health Professions Under The Board Of Licensing For Alcohol And Other Drug Use Professionals, Board Of Medicine, Board Of Mental Health Practice, Board Of Nursing, And Board Of Psychology, with the intention of expanding mental health access for Granite Staters. Ultimately, our scope is to remove barriers to licensing, but we are also discovering just how many other issues - workforce shortages, housing, insurance practices, to name a few - are involved in this complex issue.

Equality Ballot Event in Manchester

Last Thursday, I <u>attended the Battle for Ballot Equality event</u> with Congressman Chris Pappas and some of our candidates for State Representative! It was great to be with such a supportive community this close to the election - we know that we are fighting for our freedom, our families - and for leadership that has empathy and compassion.





SEA-SEIU Visit in Portsmouth

SEA-SEIU is a New Hampshire organization that supports unions across the state; I was invited to tour a Portsmouth liquor store to hear from workers and unionizers about their experiences.



It was a reminder that we need to raise wages for Granite Staters, because many folks are not making what they deserve. These workers are just one example of workers around the state that are working morning to night, doing hard physical work, with about one-third of the needed workforce. They deserve a living wage, and need a competitive wage to attract the workforce they need!

Black Lives Matter Seacoast does such great work for diversity and community. Although they were officially established in 2020, their work (supporting black families in need, providing scholarship and educational support, activating legislators and political protest) has already made an incredible impact. Childcare Tour with our next Governor - Tom Sherman!

Myself and State Senator Tom Sherman visited a daycare in Durham, A Place to Grow! This small business provides community and support for the workers at Harmony Homes. It's an innovative model where the children are in care downstairs from their homes. What a beautiful location!



Tom asked several questions about how his policies would work

for this daycare and the staff to get real feedback on their attractiveness. In particular, the ability to receive education at a reduced cost to stay in New Hampshire was a policy proposal that really connected with folks there.
