This legislation encompasses huge priorities of mine—from codifying Roe, to improving childcare, to making parentage laws more supportive for same-sex couples. These hearings are the first chance we get to show public backing and we need as many folks as possible to sign-in support [here](#).

Here’s how the week breaks down:

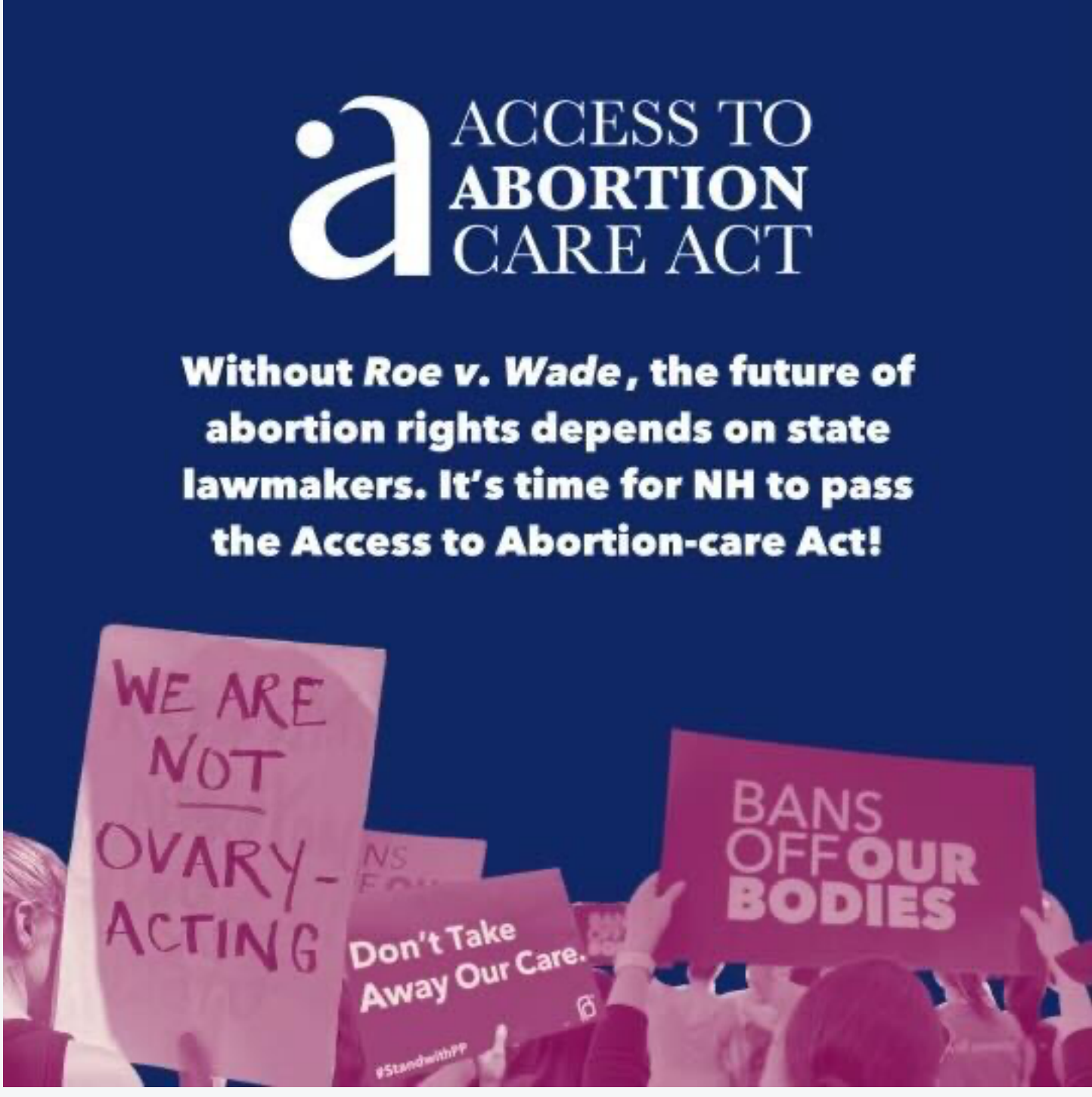
Tuesday, January 31st

SB 258: creates an exception for the disposal of highway or turnpike funded real estate under fair market value for the preservation of public interest.

Hearing: 1:15 PM, Senate Transportation Committee.

Access to Abortion-Care Act (AAA, SB 181): As we all saw this summer with the Dobbs decision, reproductive rights are under attack across the country. This piece of legislation will protect pregnant folks in New Hampshire by codifying Roe and preventing state interference in terminating pregnancy prior to 24 weeks.

Hearing: 2:00 PM, Senate Judiciary Committee.



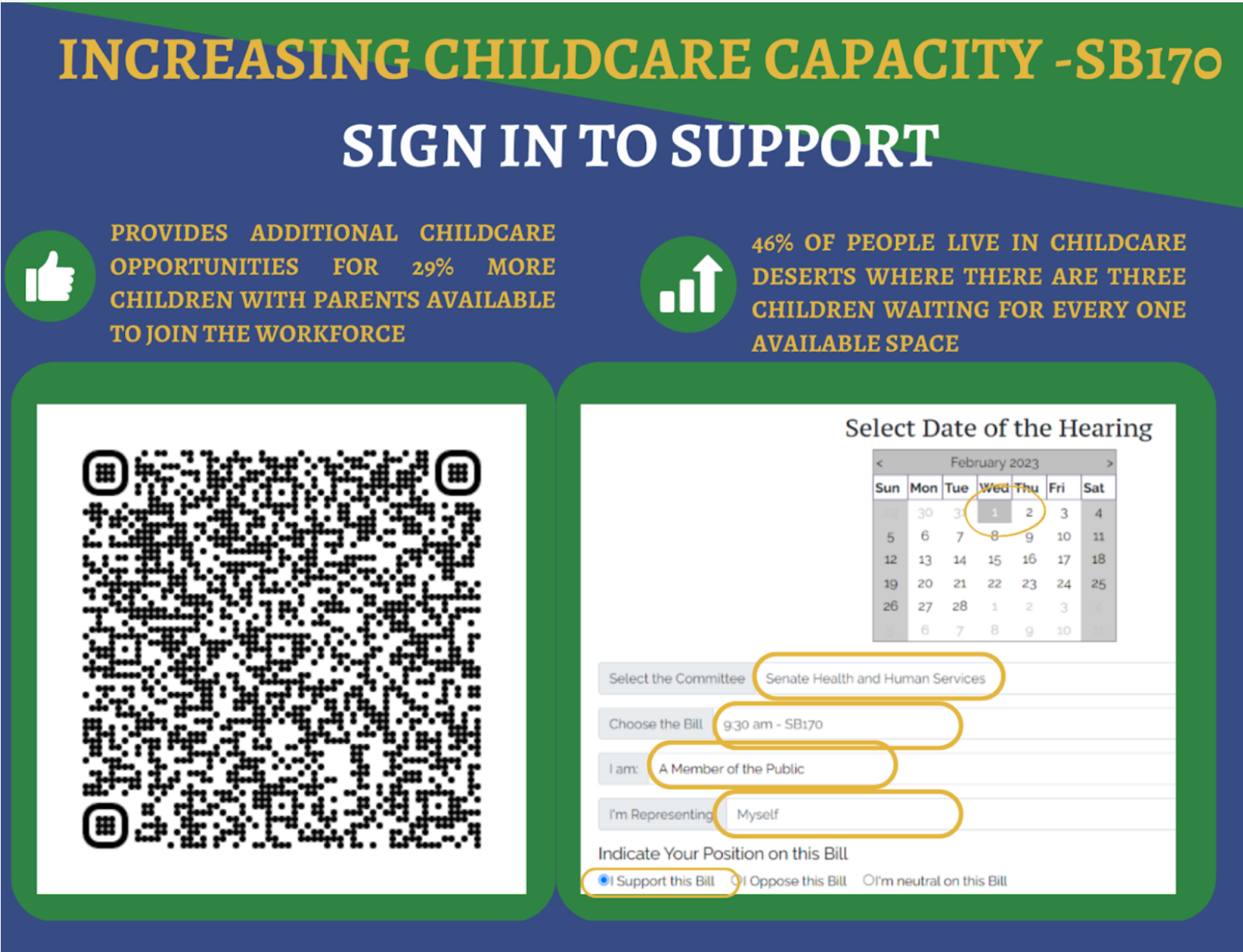
Wednesday, February 1st

Fort Constitution Days (SB 103): This bill will recognize the important contributions that the citizens of Portsmouth, New Castle, and the Seacoast made in the American Revolution.

Hearing: 9:15 AM, Senate Executive Departments and Administration Committee.

Small-Group Childcare (SB 170): In response to feedback from our small business owners and parents, this bill creates a new regulatory category for daycares that allows small group daycares outside of residential settings.

Hearing: 9:30 AM, Senate Health and Human Services Committee.



Pelvic Floor Therapy (SB 176): Mandates insurance coverage for pelvic floor therapy, crucial for postpartum mothers as they recover from childbirth.

Hearing: 9:45 AM, Senate Health and Human Services Committee.

Primary Caregivers (SB 254): Allowing judicial discretion in sentencing situations for people who are the primary caregivers to children.

Hearing: 2:00 PM, Senate Judiciary Committee.

Parentage (SB 264): Cleans up current parentage statute language to incorporate more inclusive language and better support same-sex couples having children.

Hearing: 2:15 PM, Senate Judiciary Committee.

Thursday, February 2nd

Increasing mental health workforce, SB 207: As a follow up to the Commission on Removing Barriers to Mental Health workforce I chaired this fall, this bill would establish a committee to continue to study barriers licensure of mental health professionals - in addition to the solutions we filed this session.

Hearing: 9 AM, Senate Executive Departments and Administration Committee.

Low to moderate-income Solar (SB 161): This small change in the language will allow individuals who live in housing authorities and low-income rented housing to participate in low-moderate-income community solar projects by including housing authorities as qualified account holders.

Hearing: 1 PM, Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee.
