As April comes to an end, it is important that we all stand up to ensure the safety of our Granite Staters. With the recent act of violence that took place in Portsmouth, we need to remind ourselves that hate will never be tolerated here in the beautiful state of New Hampshire.

The past two weeks have been filled with events and bill hearings that I am very happy to share with all of you.

Prime bill hearings in the House

Well, 12 of my 17 bills got out of the Senate! Being in the minority, this meant all 12 received bipartisan support, and now I am working on those bills over in the House. Some hearings we had in the last two weeks:

⚠ Housing Bill (SB-47): As the housing crisis continues, it is crucial that we look ahead to the next generation of policy solutions to ensure everyone has access to a home. This legislation will allow study to address the barriers associated with density and housing affordability.

Newington Railway Depot Bill (SB 258): This bill will create an exception for the disposal of highway or turnpike-funded real estate under fair market value for the preservation of public interest.

Town Council (SB 111): Under this legislation, Newmarket and Durham's structure of town councils will be treated on equal footing to city councils.

IVF Cost Study (SB 198): This bill would take the first step towards allowing same-sex couples equal access to insurance coverage of IVF by studying the cost.

Rarentage (SB 264): With a 20-0 vote out of committee, our parentage bill is headed to the House floor on consent! This bill would expand our assisted reproduction statute to be more inclusive of.

Budget

As mentioned in my last newsletter, the Budget is here! It came over to the Senate in early April, and had its public hearings May 2nd, at 1:00 pm and 6:00 pm. We even saw some of our littlest constituents come in support of childcare! If you're interested, re-watch at the link below.


Lee Dems
