


Hi.

Summer has finally arrived in the Granite State! I hope you have all been able to get out and enjoy the newfound warm weather.

Things are starting to wrap up in Concord, as June 30th marks the end of the legislative period. As I reflect on this past session, I truly am proud of all of the progress that we've made this year. We fought hard to pass a budget that will benefit everyone in the Granite State. The following are some highlights that are included in the upcoming budget:



Goods:

- \$134M toward raising Medicaid rates, addressing mental health, healthcare, and other workforce shortages that our residents depend on
- · Housing
 - \$30M to Affordable Housing Trust Fund with a new promise of \$5M more annually
 - o \$10M to Invest NH
 - \$5.25M to brand new Housing Champions program (my bill)
 - \$10M for homelessness
- \$170M for public education a \$80M increase in FY24 from FY22
- 12% raises for state employees so long overdue
- \$147M back to towns and cities including \$27M for wastewater, \$14M for clean water, \$105M for roads & bridges
- \$16M for moms, babies, and investments in childcare
- \$245M back to towns & cities in Rooms & Meals distributions

Bads:

- Interest & Dividends tax phaseout accelerated, and voted down carveout for those paying less than \$50,000 in taxes
- · Corporate handout to a private business of \$1.5M
- Education Freedom Accounts expanded to 350% of the Federal Poverty Level with no annual means test and no meaningful oversight
- Group II did not get its protections for recruitment and retention - which by our calculation even just changing the multiplier for calculation would have cost \$40M, which could be entirely paid by state funds

And... Housing Champions passed! This program came out of the 2019 Governor's Task Force on Housing, and has been 4 years in the works! I'm so proud to have shepherded this bill through and to see this brand new partnership between cities and towns set up.





Though things at the Capitol are coming to a close, that doesn't mean that New Hampshire politics is slowing down. On the contrary! There are a lot of positive events coming up that I'm excited to share with you all.




M NH Fishing Industry Meeting

Update on Programs Addressing the Housing Crisis From BEA

This past week, BEA (The Department of Business and Economic Affairs) released a statement regarding its plan to address the current housing crisis that is deeply affecting the state of New Hampshire. In short, the document states that the BEA has recently utilized funding from the American Rescue Plan Act and the State Fiscal Recovery Fund to bring forward more resources toward tackling the crisis. Thanks to their efforts, communities now have access to tools such as nine different Regional Housing Needs Assessments (providing data towards regional housing needs), and a New Hampshire Housing Toolbox, containing twenty different zoning guides for local government officials to take into consideration. I am very passionate about tackling the housing crisis head-on, as it deeply impacts our community as a whole. I am pleased with the effort from the BEA, and I look forward to the progress that is made in our district due to the new plans.

Biden-Harris Administration Announces New Actions to Protect LGBTQI+ Communities

In response to recent negative legislation directly targeting LGBTQI+ individuals, The White House announced new actions to protect the rights and safety of members of the community. Included in the newly enacted plan is a new LGBTQI+ Community Safety Partnership, increased support for LGBTQI+ kids (such as resources for mental health and homelessness), and a promise by the Department of Education to take on book bans targeting LGBTQI+ rights. This plan released by the Biden-Harris administration is definitely a step in the right direction toward eradicating hatred. A wonderful way to ring in Pride Month!
