I'm thankful that there was a break in the clouds for a few days so that we could finally enjoy some Summer weather!

As Summer starts to heat up, politics in the Granite State have been in full swing. I've spent the last couple of weeks advocating for a variety of critical issues- including reproductive rights, healthcare, and affordable housing. I can't wait to tell you all about it! In addition, as we look toward the upcoming season, there are many things to be excited about in the coming weeks as well.

9 My bills!

This past session I have been fortunate enough to have collaborated on several bills that have made their way to the Governor's desk to be passed into law. Through hard work and bipartisanship, I was able to work with colleagues on both sides of the aisle to create legislation that will have a positive impact on our community for years to come. I am incredibly proud of the work that we have accomplished, and I would like to share a few of the highlights with you:

Passed:

SB 145 - In other words, my Housing Champions program! It was officially adopted into the New Hampshire state budget. This program will be a partnership between the State and municipalities, allocating grant money to towns and cities that take housing-friendly actions to address the ongoing housing crisis in the Granite State. After 4 years in the works, I was so thrilled that it passed! One step closer to making housing affordable in not just the Seacoast region, but in all of the state as well.

SB 264 - My bill regarding parentage was signed into law on June 20th, and will go into effect on August 19th! The bill updates the state's statutes on assisted reproduction and further supports couples needing medical assistance to build a family - like mine!

These bills pass both chambers, and are just waiting for the Governor's signature!

SB 170 - This bill relates to small-group child daycare centers, and allows childcare for up to 12 children to be located outside of a residential setting. In other words, it allows for an increase in childcare capacity for Granite Staters!

SB 161 - This bill allows for the expansion of low-moderate income community solar projects. In turn, this bill

with allow for the reduction of carbon emissions, and increase property value in our state.

■ SB 111 - This bill is relative to governments that are closest to the people of New Hampshire: the town counciltown manager form of local government. SB 111 clarifies that towns that adopt town council-town manager charters have the same powers as city councils. It also requires that town clerks be elected regardless of the form of municipal government. Keeping the government close to the people!

■ SB 103 - Did you know that the first conflict of the American Revolution was fought right here in New Hampshire? This bill relates to commemorating that by proclaiming an observance of Fort Constitution Days!

SB 207 - Mental health is a critical aspect of healthcare that often goes overlooked. This bill establishes a committee to study the licensure of mental health professionals. SB 207 will help end the shortage of mental health professionals.

I'm proud of all that we've accomplished, and I'm excited to keep being a driving force to enact more positive legislation in our state.

Housing Champions Made the News!... Again!


June was a great month for affordable housing! New Hampshire Business Review wrote an article detailing the highs and lows of the housing shortage, including my Housing Champions program being adopted into the budget.

"Sen. Rebecca Perkins Kwoka, D-Portsmouth, was the prime sponsor of a bill this year to create a "Housing Champion" program to help municipalities cover housing infrastructure costs, provided they adopt land use regulations necessary to promote the development of workforce housing is permanent housing near places of employment.

The program, which got included in the budget bill, is intended to provide an incentive for municipalities to update their zoning ordinances in ways that make it easier for developers to build new houses and apartments," the article stated.
