Only 45% now prefer monarchy to an elected head of state: POLL

January 18, 2024

A YouGov poll, carried out on Monday and Tuesday this week, shows just 45% prefer the monarchy over an elected head of state, which is only 14 points behind, on 31%.

This is the first time YouGov has asked this question, but comes a week after a similar Savanta poll put the monarchy on 48%.

Monarchy support falls below 50% for first time: NEW POLL

January 08, 2024

A new Savanta poll shows peoples' preference for having a monarchy in the UK has fallen to just 48%. When asked "What would you prefer for the UK, a monarchy or an elected head of state?" a third (32%) said they would prefer an elected head of state.

The poll shows the monarchy is rapidly losing support, with fewer than half in all age groups under 55 preferring the royals.

A high percentage of 'Don't Knows' suggests an urgent need for a serious and open debate about the alternatives.

Monarchy falls behind republic among under 45s: POLL

March 08, 2024

For the first time more people under 45 would prefer an elected head of state than a monarch. A recent Savanta poll shows that 42% of those under 45 now prefer an elected head of state with 39% preferring a monarchy.

In November the same poll put the monarchy 3 points ahead among the under 45s. Today a republic is 3 points ahead.

A new opinion poll shows an overwhelming majority want the royals to pay for a proposed new statue of the late Queen.

The St James's Palace poll shows that 75% of respondents said the royals should pay for a proposed new statue of the late Queen.
