

# **Introduction to Organising Online Course Outline**

#### **Summary**

The Southern Initiative on Globalisation and Trade Union Rights (SIGTUR), the UnionsWA International Committee and UNI Global Union are collaborating on the delivery online of *Introduction to Organising* course aimed at Asian unionists and Asian Australians involved in regional campaigns. The course will be delivered in English but will seek to meet the needs of speakers of English as a second language by using plain language. For invited and selected participants, the course will be provided for free, although participants must have available a reliable online connection.

The course content will be based on the Leadership, Organising and Action training developed by Professor Marshall Ganz through his work at Harvard University.

The training will all be delivered online via Zoom and will be free for participants, noting that in addition to direct contact time in training there will be some reading and small group work required.
