






In 2001, a group of community activists and leaders came together to discuss the future of Santa Barbara County. This group came to the consensus that although there were numerous local organizations and activists working on a wide range of progressive causes, efforts were often fragmented and sometimes working at cross purposes. There was a clear need for a countywide organization that could bridge the gap between environmental and social justice issues and help progressives find a united vision for the future of Santa Barbara County.

In January of 2002, SBCAN was created to serve this purpose. Since our inception, many of our board members have been elected to public office, including County Supervisor Das Williams, Congressman Salud Carbajal, former Santa Barbara Mayor Helene Schneider, and Allan Hancock College Board Trustee Hilda Zacarias, and others.

Over the years, SBCAN has played important roles in opposing urban development on agricultural lands and development of dangerous fossil-fuel projects. At the same time, SBCAN has supported development of alternative energy and affordable housing, advocated for immigrant rights, and sponsored programs to engage inner-city residents in community gardening and educational arts programs.

SBCAN is celebrating its 20th anniversary this year. Thank you for helping make it into a force for change throughout the county!

Women seeking reproductive health care in Santa Barbara have reason to thank Hannah-Beth Jackson for her work as an attorney for Planned Parenthood.

In the early 1980s she sued to protect clients from harassment by protesters who were following them into the parking lot at the clinic.



The protesters claimed free speech rights but Hannah-Beth Jackson successfully argued that Planned Parenthood was a business, not an open forum like a shopping center and could limit access to its property.

Women have since been able to receive the health care they wish at Planned Parenthood without provocation.

HANNAH-BETH JACKSON

SBCAN considers it an honor and privilege to honor Senator Hannah-Beth Jackson for her decades of blazing trails in service to the public.

Her remarkable story starts at the age of seven when she wanted to join Little League, but was denied the privilege because she was a girl. It didn't matter that she was one of the best players. That was her introduction to gender inequities, which later inspired her to break down gender-based barriers as an attorney and elected official.

Jackson served as a California state senator from 2012 to 2020, a state assemblymember from 1998 to 2004, started two nonprofits, served as the first policy-maker in residence at UCSB, served as adjunct professor at Antioch University and is an attorney, among other accomplishments.

As a senator, she wrote and passed bills that expanded family leave, established one of the strongest equal pay laws in the nation, required gender diversity on corporate boards in California and expanded voting rights. She supported environmental justice and natural resource protections, commuter rail, childhood education, veterans treatment courts, privacy protections, reducing gun violence and much more.

Jackson has received "Legislator of the Year" awards from a wide range of organizations. She was also recognized by Huffington Post when they named her one of 11 women "blazing new trails in American politics," and the New York Times called her the "State Senator shifting California's workplace culture."

Today's brunch honors Senator Jackson's commitment to serving our community and celebrate her many achievements. The event will also help SBCAN raise funds we need to keep doing our part to carry this type of work forward.

Award-winning author and journalist Starshine Roshell will engage Jackson in a conversation about her public service. Senator Monique Limón, who now holds the seat from which Senator Jackson retired, will also speak. Professional performer Gale McNeeley will entertain the audience with his rendition of "Shakespearean Baseball Game" in recognition of Jackson's love of baseball and the Boston Red Sox.


