

CANDIDATE EVALUATION, VETTING AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Spokane County has over 250 elected offices, 21 are partisan where the candidate declares their political party preference and the remaining offices are non-partisan. **Partisan** offices include the Congressional 5th District (1), State Legislative Districts (5 Districts, 1 Senator, 2 Representatives each), and County Commissioner Districts (5). **Non-partisan offices** include Mayoral; City Council; Town Council; School Board Director; Spokane Valley Fire, Spokane County Fire District, Water District, Cemetery District and Park District Commissioners, and Judicial.

Each of these offices have their own specific function but <u>collectively</u> they impact our quality of life, property, safety, education, and the economy therefore, it is the Spokane County Republican Party's <u>Mission</u> "to promote good government by <u>Getting Republicans Elected</u> at all levels, <u>Support</u> them, and <u>Hold Them Accountable</u>" once elected. The first step in this Mission is the process to recruit, evaluate, and vett quality candidates who are challenging or running for an open seat or engage incumbents, evaluate their performance, and determine if further support is **deserved**.

The Spokane County Republican Party's Vision is to "fill every seat in Spokane County including local, city, county, state and federal elections with people who support the **Constitution of the United States** and the **Republican Platform**.
