Tell us about yourself.

"I am a husband, father of four, a retired US Navy Chief Warrant Officer and I currently serve on the Peninsula School Board, including being board chair in 2021 and I am the current vice chair.

I had the honor of serving in the U.S. Navy for 28 years, enlisting right out of high school, reaching the rank of Chief Warrant Officer. I entered as an enlisted electronics technician and later I had the demanding and exciting job of Navy Diver - doing underwater ships husbandry, experimental and saturation diving, and various classified projects. My wife of 25 years, Tonia — a Washington native – and I needed to pick where we would live after I retired from the Navy. While stationed in Italy, we used the internet to research school districts and chose to move to the Peninsula School District to ensure our four children received an excellent education.

During my military career, I was always immersed in my local community while serving in locations and bases all over the world. I've seen what education systems look like in Korea, Guam, Puerto Rico, Italy, and other parts of the world, as a parent.

I have had a lifelong passion for serving others, and it is important to

me to support local organizations and causes. My father was a police officer, and my mother was a District Judge's legal assistant, so I was raised to give back and to make things better than I found them. Today, I sit on the Board of the Greater Gig Harbor Foundation; serving on the Education Cabinet and as Chair of the Students of Distinction Committee; and is a member of the Friday morning Rotary Club. I previously served as President of the City Club of Tacoma; Vice President of the Hilltop Business Association; and served on the board of the local FISH Food Bank.

I was first elected to the Peninsula School District Board in 2013 and was twice reelected since. During that time, I have served as President and Vice President, and Legislative Representative.

I care deeply about my community, and I am passionate about making it the best possible place to live and raise a family. I am committed to working with statewide stakeholders to make our Washington Public Schools the best in the country. To provide all students with a pathway to achieve academic excellence and make sure they have the tools academically, emotionally, socially—to achieve their unique goals."

Describe your duty to the office you are running for and how you will achieve success.

First, I will restore local control to all the school board members across the state.

I will meet with school superintendents and school boards across the state to ask how I can help. Chris Reykdal says it's his way or the highway, threatening to withdraw school funding.

I will restore parent voice and make sure policy allows them to be part of the policy processes in their school i.e. curriculum development committees, literacy task forces, etc.

I will meet regularly with state legislatures to encourage them to change the state's focus back toward educating students on how to read, write, do math, etc. rather than focusing on divisive social justice agendas.

I will bring in trusted experts and advisors to complete a top to bottom review of all OSPI processes and departments and restructure them, as needed, to be more efficient and to totally focus on helping students achieve 100% success.

As a navy officer, I always took the time to observe, listen, ask questions before making changes. Changes must be made at OPSI, however I will make certain they are made correctly with a focus on the kids and supporting school boards and parents.

What does success look like for this position and what key performance indicators should voters use to evaluate you?

Teachers, students, and parents are stressed out and tired of the current leadership of Chris Reykdal. Success will take many forms however academic success has to be priority one. Across the state, on average, less than 50% of students can read and write at grade level. That is unacceptable. We need to get back to the basics and remove the divisive social agendas.

I will eliminate unnecessary departments and positions, especially if they were established to infringe upon local school boards and parents.

However, the liberals in this state are doing their best to place medical centers in public schools - and I absolutely oppose that. I will have quarterly Zoom meetings with Superintendents and School Boards to keep my ears open as to how I can help them be successful. As I said, I will embrace the local control. It is not my job to tell the school boards how to do their jobs, it is my to ask them how I can help them be successful.

There are three conservatives running for this position. Both of my conservative opponents are good men who care about making a difference.
