

WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND PROTECTION POLICY



The Shooters Fishers and Farmers Party recognises that biological women have the right to safe, fair, and respectful treatment in every aspect of public and private life. Women should never feel that their safety, dignity, or opportunities are being compromised. We stand firmly for the protection of biological women in their spaces, public or private spaces, facilities, sport, and events.

The erosion of women's rights in the name of political correctness undermines fairness and safety. Our Party believes that women and girls deserve protections that are clear, enforceable, and free from compromise.

WHAT WE BELIEVE

- 1. Biological women have the right to safe and private access to toilets, change rooms, and other single-sex facilities.
- 2. Public spaces, events, and support services must be protected for the comfort and protection of biological women and girls.
- 3. Women's sport must be fair, with competition based on biological sex only, to preserve integrity and opportunity.
- 4. The rights of women and girls should not be undermined by activist-driven policies that ignore biological reality and compromise biological women.
- 5. Women should be free to speak up for their safety and rights without fear of harassment, violence, censorship, discrimination or litigation.



OUR ACTION PLAN

- 1. Protect Spaces Intended for Biological Women: Enshrine the right for biological women to access female-only toilets, change rooms, spaces virtual and real, refuges, and facilities without compromise.
- 2. Protect Women's Sport: Legislate to ensure sporting competitions are based on biological sex, preserving fairness and safety for women and girls.
- 3. Protect Women's Events and Services: Guarantee that women's events, health services, and refuges remain dedicated to biological women.
- 4. Community Education: Promote awareness that protecting women's rights is not about exclusion but about fairness, safety, and dignity.
- 5. Freedom to Speak: Defend the right of women, sporting bodies, and community groups to advocate for women's rights without fear of being silenced or punished.
- 6. Evidence-Based Policy: Ensure that government laws and funding decisions on women's rights are grounded in biological reality, fairness, and <u>common</u> sense not political ideology.
