- Be more community minded volunteer. All the Board of directors are volunteers and have been busy establishing the party. As time goes on, I am sure we will be able to support worthy courses. We are particularly interested in supporting young shooters, as they are the future.
- Have several dedicated Face Book operators to increase our followers to get our message out. Agree with this, do we have anyone who can assist in this area?
- Fundraise more. We are open to suggestions.
- Travel the state organise meetings to get the message out. We are hoping the candidates will be doing this once they have passed the selection process and signed their contracts.
- Be aligned with likeminded organisations Yes, as mentioned in this newsletter can you invite the candidates to answer questions and talk policies.
- Membership Officer database experience. This is the most important job as our membership is our lifeline. Who can assist? You will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement.
