# SHBE Mission Statement

Saskatchewan Home Based Educators (SHBE) is the official voice of home-based educators in Saskatchewan. We assist in creating a positive social network and a positive political environment for all those who choose home-based education. We also provide supportive, social and instructional resources for our members.

## **What Does SHBE Do for Me?**

The mandate of SHBE is to, “assist in creating a positive social network and a positive political environment for all those who choose home-based education in Saskatchewan. We also provide supportive, social and instructional resources for our members.”

More specifically, here are some of the things SHBE does for you:

- First and foremost, SHBE is your voice to government. The Ministry of Education has agreed to hear the voice of SHBE as the voice of homeschoolers in this province. The SHBE president meets with the Director of Home-Based Education at the Department of Education on an infrequent but regular basis, and with the Minister of Education less frequently. These meetings are our opportunities to take the concerns we hear from you to the people who are responsible for writing and implementing homeschooling regulations in our province.
- We are also often your voice to school division officials and staff. Every fall and every spring, and often times in between, board members receive phone calls asking questions and looking for guidance on dealing with school divisions who have misinterpreted the regulations or are overstepping their authority in some way. We are often able to help homeschooling parents navigate these challenges and every year we take issues to the Ministry of Education when they cannot be resolved locally.
- The SHBE board is responsible for building a convention committee which runs the provincial convention every year. The convention volunteers work to give homeschooling parents interesting and informative speakers and workshops on a variety of homeschooling topics and issues. They also organize an exhibit hall with curriculum providers and other exhibitors of interest to homeschooling families.
- SHBE works to build homeschool leaders in our province by subsidizing board members and convention committee members who would like to attend the HSLDA National Leadership Conference every year. This conference allows us to meet homeschool leaders from across Canada and learn about homeschooling issues and organizations across the country and around the world.
- Finally, SHBE board members work to support homeschooling families by being involved with local support groups, by holding homeschool information nights every now and then, and by being accessible to answer your questions and concerns. The SHBE help desk receives questions and inquiries from homeschoolers, potential homeschoolers, and those interested in communicating with homeschoolers in Saskatchewan. We communicate with you through our newsletter, the Journal, our website, and our Facebook and Instagram pages.

### Keynote Presentations

#### **Friday 1:00-2:15pm - Sanctuary**

**The Connecting Power of Adventure** — In this talk, Greta shares why adventures build connections. Pulling from her own life experiences, she shows the powerful way adventures bond families together. Then she provides practical ways for you to begin building an adventurous life with your own children and connect with their hearts along the way. Whether your kids are young, or you have teenagers already, Greta has ideas to help you get started. She'll share ideas for both outdoor and indoor adventures, ideas for the family who physically can't hit the hiking trail, and even ways to adventure through books! Greta wants to give you the tools to make adventures happen, so you will feel empowered to go out and begin connecting with your kids in a deep and meaningful way.

#### **Friday 6:30-7:30pm - Sanctuary**

**Parenting the Passionate Child** — So often, parents of passionate children feel alone in their parenting journey. In this talk, Greta encourages every parent of passionate children and tells them they are not alone. She shares honest parts of her own journey parenting passionate children, and all the positive things God has brought about through the journey. Greta also offers practical tips to help you help your passionate child grow and blossom. Her goal in this talk is not to tell parents how to fix their children, but rather to see the gift that passion is to our children and how it can be used for good.

#### **Saturday 9:30-10:45am - Sanctuary**

**Learning to Love Nature Through Literature** — In this talk, Greta encourages parents to take their kids outside and learn in nature, passionately explaining the benefits of outdoor and hands on learning. Greta shares how her own love for nature, and therefore nature study, grew out of a childhood love of books. She then offers practical tips for choosing books that focus on nature, beautiful storytelling, and teaching. Greta also describes the benefits of nature journaling, and how to do nature study and journaling outdoors or through a book.

#### **Saturday 3:00-4:30pm - Sanctuary**

**Fighting for Joy** — In this talk, Greta shares her conviction that joy is not something trite or frivolous, but an essential element to our Christian walk. Through moving personal stories, Greta relates moments when she has struggled to find joy in her own life, and then offers some specific steps for her listeners to embrace, chase and choose joy, even when it is difficult. This talk will leave your audience feeling understood, encouraged, and inspired at the same time.

**Math-U-See - Jacki Knight** began home educating her 3 children in 1988. She has taught, written and consulted for Home Education around the world. Vance and his wife have three daughters, all of whom they have homeschooled. Vance travels worldwide researching, writing, and speaking on Creation and its vital importance to the Christian faith.

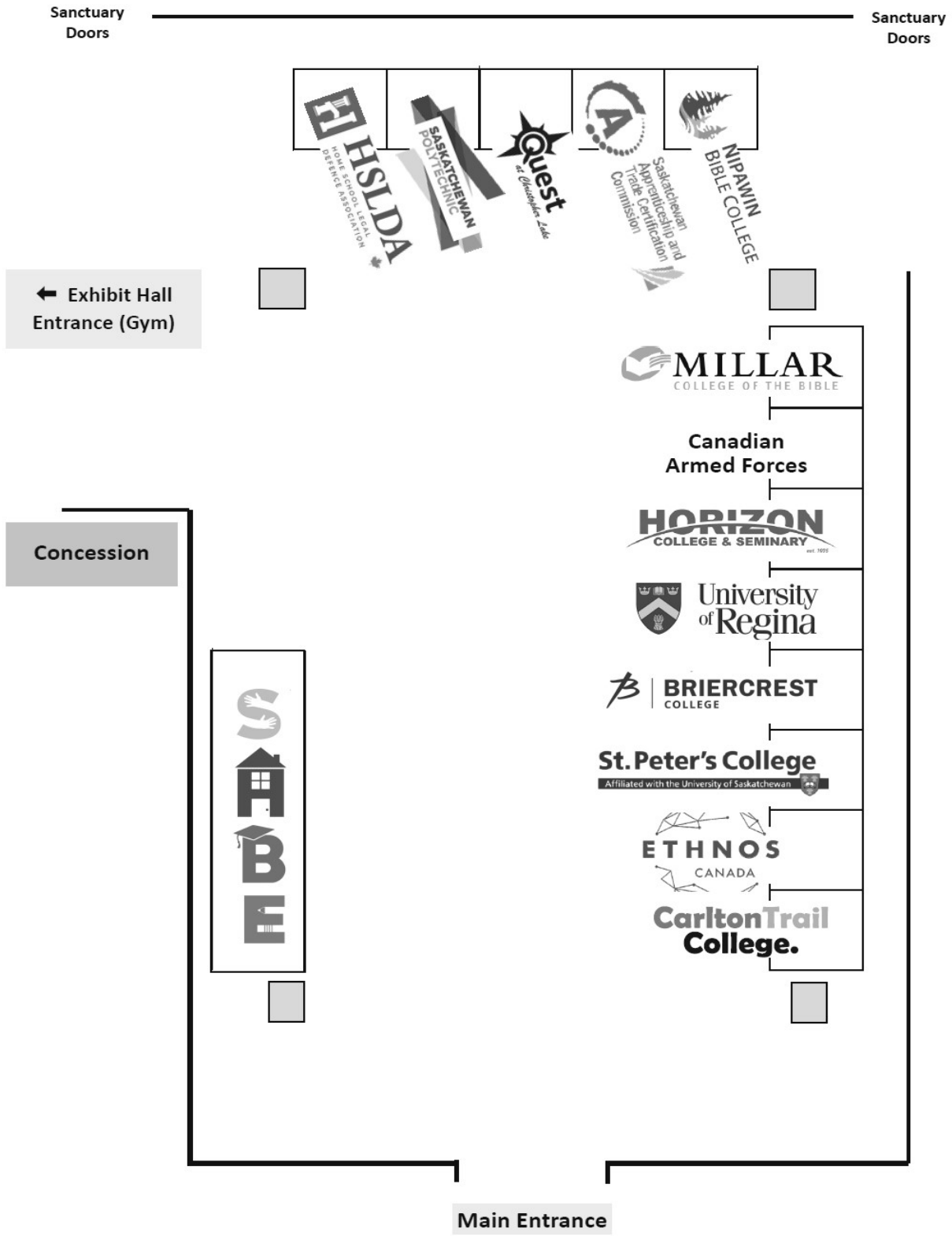
