Toronto's over 9,000 nonprofits employ close to 200,000 people, representing almost one in every seven workers in our city. This is equivalent to employment in Toronto's technology sector, food and beverage sector, and pharmaceutical sectors combined.

Nonprofits mobilize over 1 million volunteers each year, or one in three Torontonians, and represent 5.1% of Toronto's GDP-almost three times that of Toronto's tourism industry.
