The Homegrown Power Plan recommends an increase in ARENA funding from \$1.3 billion to \$2 billion and restoring ARENA's grant making function.

The CEFC should also be strengthened, with more choice provided to the agency about what projects it invests in by lowering how much interest it charges on the loans it makes.
