Adani Enterprises leaders tell major investor Vanguard that, "...they had capped the size of the (Carmichael) mine and intended to set an end date for operations to fit within the parameters of a 1.5°C warming scenario." (In 2021 the International Energy Agency said limiting global warming to 1.5°C requires an immediate end to all coal expansion. If Adani were serious about ending operations in line with 1.5°C they would have already abandoned the project.)
