
Hey there! Thanks for being a zero waste volunteer! We're excited to have you helping out. Here's a quick guide to help you during your shift!

Waste reduction is an important component of a healthy, sustainable community...





And what better place than VegFest to demonstrate this??





As you may know, at VegFest we are striving to make this a REDUCED WASTE EVENT THIS YEAR.

That means we want to divert

through recycling & composting



Your mission, should you choose to accept it, is to oversee a VegFest reduced waste station and educate participants on what is and is not recyclable, what is compostable and what is landfill trash.



It is extremely important that folks dispose of the right items in the correct bins to avoid contamination and help us reduce as much waste as possible.

What's COMPOSTABLE:





ALLFOOD WASTE AND LIQUIDS FROM DRINKS









Make sure everyone pours liquids from drinks into the compost bin! (This makes bag changes and clean up sooooo much easier!)





What's LANDFILL TRASH ::

CONDIMENT PACKETS










STRAWS

Bags fillin' up??

We recommend compost and recycling bags be changed as they get close to ¾ full, to make sure they can be tied close and prevent them from getting too heavy.

There should be extra bin liners available at each of the waste stations.

If the stations are overflowing please flag down convention center staff for assistance.

Did something end up in the wrong bin?





Even though you are hard at work making sure the right items end up in the right bins, mistakes happen and occasionally an item may accidentally be thrown in the wrong bin.

If this happens, gloves will be available at each waste station to keep hands clean while removing the wrong item.

 By documenting what is being put in the bins we will have a better idea on how VegFest can make improvements next year!




And now where is my station assignment?
