## Request made under the Official Information Act 1982

Thank you for your email of 8 July 2025 requesting information under the Official Information Act 1982 regarding the commissioning and installation of artwork on the Te Ahu a Turanga – Manawatū Tararua Highway project. I will address each part below.

The total cost of all artworks associated with the project, including design, fabrication, transport, installation, and any related cultural or consultation processes

The total cost of the mahi toi cultural artworks was \$5.045 million. For context, the total cost of mahi toi represents 0.6 per cent of the total budget.

The process by which artists were selected, including any open calls, tenders, or direct appointments

The selection process for determining the mahi toi artists was led by the project's iwi partners:

- Rangitāne o Manawatū
- Rangitāne o Tamaki nui-a-Rua
- Ngāti Kahungunu ki Tāmaki nui-a-Rua
- Te Runanga o Raukawa (Ngāti Raukawa ki te Tonga and Nga Kaitiaki ō Ngāti Kauwhata).

The project's iwi partners nominated artists based on their knowledge of the area and their proven track record of delivering cultural artworks. The selected artists were then endorsed by the Project's Iwi Working Group, which includes representatives from each partner iwi and NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA).

Any documentation or advice received by Waka Kotahi or the project alliance in support of including these artworks (e.g. cultural, landscape or community impact assessments)

I am refusing this part of your request under section 18(d) of the Act, as the information you are seeking is already publicly available.

lwi were supportive of the integration of mahi toi in the project through collaboration with NZTA. Their involvement covered the design and consenting phases, cultural monitoring throughout construction, and the inclusion of cultural design elements.

Whether any of the costs were funded from outside Waka Kotahi's budget (e.g. by iwi, local councils, or other central government funds)

The mahi toi programme was funded as part of Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway budget, which was funded through the National Land Transport Programme.

Any evaluation or reporting carried out on the value or public reception of the artworks

NZTA did not produce a report on the value of including mahi toi as part of the project. Therefore, I am refusing this part of the request under section 18(e) of the Act as the information requested does not exist or, despite reasonable efforts to locate it, cannot be found.
