



We have excluded undecideds from the base of our calculation. This is consistent with media reporting of headline poll results in New Zealand. Please note the margin of error is slightly higher when undecideds are excluded (5%).*

The July Auckland Ratepayers'
Alliance/Curia poll confirms that
the Auckland mayoral race is wide
open. In contrast to our June poll, we
included New Conservative leader Ted
Johnston and gave respondents the
ability to nominate another candidate.
Councillor Efeso Collins (Manukau), the
presumptive front-runner, has a marginal
lead over Leo Molloy. But the two other
big names, Viv Beck and Wayne Brown,
are very much in contention. A large
number of respondents (35%) were still
undecided.

If the Auckland Mayoralty is a choice between the following candidates, which one are you most likely to vote for at this stage, even if not entirely decided.






Auckland Mayoral choice

Name recognition



Favourability



The poll found that of the main candidates, Molloy had the highest name recognition (67%) but the lowest net favourability (-5). Despite relatively low name recognition (52%), Collins had a net favourability rating comparable to the incumbent Mayor Phil Goff. These numbers suggest that Brown and Beck have a disadvantage when it comes to name recognition but have a positive image with those voters who do recognise them.

POLL DATES: Sun 03 to Sun 10 July 2022. The median response

was collected on Thu 07 July 2022.

TARGET POPULATION: Eligible Auckland voters.

SAMPLE POPULATION: Eligible Auckland voters who are contactable on a

landline or mobile phone or online panel.

SAMPLE SIZE: 500 respondents agreed to participate – 250 via

phone and 250 via online panel.

SAMPLE SELECTION: A random selection of 20,000 phone numbers and a

random selection from the online panel.

WEIGHTING: The results are weighted to reflect the overall voting

adult population of Auckland in terms of gender and

age.

SAMPLE ERROR: Based on this sample of 500 respondents, the

maximum sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/-

4.4%, at the 95% confidence level.

CODE COMPLIANCE: This poll was conducted in accordance with the

Research Association New Zealand Code of Practice

and the International Chamber of Commerce/ European Society for Opinion and Market Research

Code on Market and Social Research.







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
