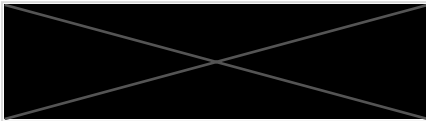

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Motivation

Why are you running for *this* office?

San Francisco is under attack by the wealthiest, greediest, most reactionary, and corrupt forces in the nation right now ... and nobody carries their water more than Matt Dorsey.

We are all working harder and harder with less and less to show for it, and MAGA Matt Dorsey is more concerned with protecting billionaires or writing resolutions about Hasan Piker than the overwhelming majority of people in D6 just trying to get by.

Why do I call him MAGA Matt?

What other political movement falls in line with a real estate profiteer with a well-known history of being a slumlord? (And not only does MAGA Matt oppose the Affordable Housing Guarantee Act, he ignores the rampant habitability issues in rent-controlled units and SROs all over the District)

What other political movement falls in line with credibly accused sexual predators? (And Manny isn't the only predator MAGA Matt aligns himself with ... Ricci Wynne and Jason Peterson are two more)

What other political movement falls in line with AI, cryptocurrency, and surveillance state oligarchs? (MAGA Matt is proud that Flock cameras are surveilling and monetizing our every move. And he doesn't have a thing to say about SFPD wilding out during Pride Weekend or an out of control DA over-charging our friends and neighbors)

There's a heckuva lot more, but that's more than enough to show why Dorsey has earned his MAGA Matt moniker.

I am also running for the Board of Supervisors because there is no great threat to my safety and well-being than deranged billionaires, ruthless corporations, and greedy landlords

Just like the Right to Counsel law has been effective in combating evictions, San Francisco also needs a Right to Counsel law for workers ... wage theft and brutal working conditions are unlawful and rampant. In addition to organizing workplaces, workers need the protections existing laws afford them. (As I've come to learn, a labor law that is not used doesn't practically exist.)

There are criminal consequences for landlords and property management firms that neglect habitability issues. There's also irrefutable reason to believe SF landlords engage in illegal price-fixing. A supervisor must use all the levers of power at their disposal to get City Government to address the actual lawlessness harming most San Franciscans.

I'll close by sharing that I believe every person struggling to get by is a policy expert ... because we are on the receiving end of the laws and processes that have been corrupted by those exploiting us.

So it's important to have someone on the Board who has been exploited on the job by a corporation, or suffered from constant neglect by greedy landlords and property management firms, or had their weekly budget blown because MUNI has been cut so badly that they had to shell out \$35 they couldn't really afford to tech company like Uber.

What are your values, and how did you get them?

I value kindness, collaboration, truthfulness, courage, and fairness.

What communities do you represent, and how do they hold you accountable?

I've been endorsed by Juanita More, and if I earn the League's endorsement that would be amazing. I am also working to get the endorsement of the Harvey Milk LGBTQ Democratic Club

What are the top three issues you will work on, and what is your plan for achieving your goals?

What local and state commissions or policy bodies have you served on?

I've been trying to scratch out a living ... I've come to understand that is invaluable policy experience

What political organizations are you a member of (e.g., democratic clubs)?

I am still registered to vote as a Democrat

What for-profit or non-profit boards have you served on, including political organizations?

What campaigns have you worked on?

I got my start as a canvasser for the CA League of Conservation Voters in 1991 and helped Anna Eshoo get elected to the House from the Peninsula in 1992. I have also worked for Democratic candidates for Congress and the US Senate all over the United States.

A car plowed into where I was sitting on the way back from Sacramento in 2014 which required a hiatus from campaign work. I returned to political work in 2020 and went to North Carolina to do voting rights and ballot protection to stop Trump from disenfranchising predominantly African American voters. In 2024, I worked as a field organizer for Dean Preston's campaign.

I am also working on an effort called the Neglected Voter Project ... in San Francisco, there were 663,453 people eligible to vote for the November 2024 election. 412,231 people voted ... with roughly 250,000 people who could have voted staying home. With elections so often decided by a few thousand votes one way or the other citywide, it is CRUCIAL for us to understand why so many eligible voters who agree with us don't participate ... then work to address the things impacting their lives and mobilize them to sweep corporate backed politicians out of office.

It also happens that D6 is chock full of eligible voters who stay home. (In 2022, only 16,202 voters - out of 33,914 who were REGISTERED* - cast a ballot for Supervisor ... and only 8,546 ranked Dorsey higher than his competitors)

*The CA Secretary of State does not tabulate the number of eligible voters for Supe districts ... they only tabulate the Voting Eligible Population countywide)

What recent candidates and ballot measures have you supported financially?

I haven't been in a position to give contributions of any kind :(

What is one concrete thing about the League of Pissed Off Voters (for example, something we have done, said, or published) that you appreciate and that would make you proud to have our endorsement?

I cannot choose between the Tenants Right to Counsel and the Vacant Homes Tax ;)

Board of Supervisors

How long have you lived in your supervisor district?

5 months

How would you explain the biggest challenges your district faces?

The biggest challenge is Evil Real Estate Profiteering ... from the racist real estate redevelopment plan for 6th Street to unconscionable landlord neglect of habitability to the greed of landlord price-gouging/price-fixing of BOTH residential and commercial tenants. (Not a week goes by without at least one or two local businesses getting their rent doubled or more by soulless landlords)

Racist over-policing that wastefully most tax dollars and starves the things that keep our communities strong and safe

Surveillance state Flock cameras tracking and monetizing our every move to train god only knows what kind robot weapons that will boost shareholder value for Chris Larsen and Y combinator's militarized policing corporations

Slashed MUNI service

What do you feel are your district's biggest opportunities?

The people of D6 are what's best ... and stopping big corporations and landlords from extracting everything from us will allow people to do things to make our neighborhoods vibrant again

In what ways would your work as supervisor align with, or be different from, the last supervisor from this district?

Do you support getting rid of district elections for the Board of Supervisors? Why or why not?

Keep district elections. Corporations and the uber-wealthy have enough power over our lives as it is ... we can't let them rig election process to steal City Hall too

Which specific city services do you feel should be protected from budget cuts, but have not been?

MUNI, Rent Relief and Tenant Protections, Schools, Community Ambassadors, Food assistance,

I would have voted no, and done whatever I could to delay and stall the process

The voices of hundreds of thousands of us just trying to get by and stay in the communities of this city we love

Did you join educators at the UESF picket line during the strike? Which school site did you go to and why?

I did not join educators on the picket line ... I started a job as a resident manager of a badly neglected building during the strike (which turned out to be a nearly full time job for the SF minimum wage) ... I deeply regret not having the capacity to get out to the strike sites.

How will you vote on the Affordable Housing Guarantee Act in the November election? Explain your position.

Yes. That money needed to be going to rent relief and housing that most San Franciscans scraping by can afford since it was initially passed

How will you vote on the Mayor's Clean Up City Hall ballot measures on the November ballot? Explain your position.

No ... it' doesn't clean up a thing because it's a power grab by the same billionaires and elites already corrupting our laws

How would you address affordability in your District? Provide concrete ideas.

Freeze increases on apartments that become vacant. Expand rent control to newer buildings. Stop Landlords from using price-fixing services like Yardi Systems. (See Duffy v Yardi Systems to understand the rampant price-fixing nationwide)
