Leah was previously based in Adelaide, and has spent almost a decade working with remote Aboriginal communities in the north west of South Australia on feral camel management, pastoral enterprises and other cultural and natural resource management projects.

Leah was the Regional Manager for the Alinytjara Wilurara (AW) Natural Resource Management Board - the only all Indigenous NRM Board in Australia. This experience has given Leah a solid understanding of Indigenous governance and administration of a statutory body. In 2018, Leah led the tender submission for the Board to the National Landcare Program 2, resulting in \$8M investment for the AW region for 2019-2023.

Leah has worked with Aboriginal communities across SA, QLD and WA in several areas including on-country engagement, workshop facilitation, and governance support. She has strong on-ground relationships with Traditional Owner groups and their partners. Leah can lead and support the development and implementation of programs and is passionate about supporting and engaging with Traditional Owner led initiatives.
