ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Hunter Schwartz, Fargo South 2021



WHAT HAVE YOU DONE SINCE GRADUATING?

Since graduating I've attended and graduated from MSUM with a degree in Broadcast Journalism along with a Minor in Communications. I started an internship with WDAY in between my last two semesters of college and worked part-time during my final semester. Since then I've been working full-time at WDAY as a multimedia reporter for news and sports.

HOW DO YOU FEEL YOUR EDUCATION AT FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS HELPED PREPARE YOU FOR YOUR CURRENT CAREER?

The job I work now involves talking and connecting with lots of people in the community. I was really shy as a kid and being able to talk through school or real life issues with teachers helped me tremendously throughout high school.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY.

Both of my parents are also Fargo South graduates from the 80s. I had the privilege of growing up through Fargo Public Schools with my twin sister as well.

WHAT IS YOUR BEST MEMORY OF YOUR TIME AT FARGO NORTH?

It's hard to pinpoint just one. I think a lot of people would agree with me when I say that my senior year as a whole was really fun. COVID-19 threw a wrench into things and changed up the process and classes, but I felt the most comfortable with fellow classmates and teachers that year, and miss a lot of the people that I shared classes and lunch tables with that I got to share a graduation class with as well.

WHO INSPIRED YOU THE MOST AT FARGO NORTH AND WHY?

While he's not there anymore, Dr. Eric Saari taught Jazz Band during my first three years. I had many conversations about what I wanted to do when I graduated high school with him. I also had many conversations about how to deal with real-life issues. I remember he'd drop whatever he was doing if I knocked on his door and needed his input. I recently got to see him for the first time in three years while I was working. We lost track of time talking about how each of us were doing on our new endeavors. He's a teacher and a person that I'll always mention when I think of people that helped me get to where I am today.

IS THERE ANY OTHER INFORMATION YOU WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH US?

Be comfortable with going out of your comfort zone. I never thought as a kid that I'd be talking with dozens of people a day and putting my face on other people's TVs. I was always self-conscious about what people thought of me or how people would treat me if I did or said something wrong. Growing up through Fargo South taught me to not put too much pressure on myself even if I do mess up. It's inevitable that it'll happen at some point, it's just about if you learn from it and how you bounce back.

CHRISTOPHER DOMITROVICH- CLASS OF 1995

These words from Randy Fuss, ND Air National Guard Board Member, echo what others have shared on behalf of Col. Domitrovich: "The Bruin 'Strive for Excellence' embodied with Colonel Domitrovich is one of the most remarkable qualities and can be witnessed in his unwavering dedication to his team and mission."

Perhaps Chris's learning experiences as a Fargo Public Schools Junior Air Force ROTC Cadet Lieutenant Colonel on both the Color Guard and the Drill Team led him to dedicate himself to enhancing the safety of our nation and helped him polish self-discipline. Perhaps being on the varsity swim and golf teams helped him foster resilience. Perhaps his resolve in earning the Eagle Scout badge taught Chris to be strategic and honorable. All this and more lead Chris from South High to UND for a major in Commercial Aviation, National Intelligence University in Washington D.C. for an M.S. in Strategic Intelligence and the United States Naval War College in Newport, R.I. for an M.A. in National Security and Strategic Studies. Chris has been vigilant in his quest for excellence in service.

Colonel Domitrovich is the current commander of the 119th Wing, North Dakota Air National Guard. He commands almost 1,200 Airmen who train to, and execute, world-class MQ-9 persistent attack and reconnaissance, kinetic and non-kinetic intelligence target production expeditionary combat support for our nation and state. Among many commendable assignments on his rise to Commander, Colonel Domitrovich has served as an Instructor Pilot, Command Pilot, and Executive Officer to the Director of the Air National Guard in the Pentagon. Colonel Domitrovich is the recipient of multiple medals, awards, and decorations. "His leadership, dedication, and Integrity have left an indelible mark..." as shared by Randy Fuss.

JASON MCCARTHY - CLASS OF 1989

Jason McCarthy's four years of high school math, science and Spanish, along with Advanced Placement classes provided a solid academic foundation. Choir and theater allowed his creativity and empathy to flourish. It was Speech and Debate that became Jason's entry to his career path. Jason and his debate partner won many tournaments including the North Dakota State Championship. Qualifying for the National Tournament and placing in the top ten. Jason admits, "Debate taught me that hard work and preparation are keys to success."

Jason pursued a Criminal Justice degree at MSU-Moorhead and graduated with distinction from UND School of Law. Jason's work ethic and commitment to serve others propelled Jason up the ladder of success. As an Assistant State's Attorney, Jason was responsible for the prosecution of felony and misdemeanor crimes with a specialty in the prosecution of domestic violence, crimes against children, sexual assaults and murder. As Chief Deputy State's Attorney, Jason was the supervising attorney for the criminal division of the Grand Forks County State's Attorney's Office. He supervised and mentored



support staff and attorneys assigned to the criminal division besides prosecuting a full caseload. As District Judge, Jason currently presides over criminal and civil bench and jury trials, drafts opinions and orders and spearheaded the Domestic Violence Court Pilot Program as requested by the North Dakota Supreme Court.

Dan Mahli stated, "Judge McCarthy takes his work seriously and manages it with competence, compassion, and sensitivity. Jason has a unique ability to relate to the folks he comes in contact with, from students and long-time residents, to Native and New Americans, to area business and governmental leaders. People seek out Jason for answers because he goes out of his way to listen, address issues, and helps find resolution."



KELLY NORMAN - CLASS OF 1978

"He certainly is a consummate example of what a quality education, coupled with diverse life experiences and good choices can become - an individual that makes a difference within society, that's Kelly Norman." (Frederick Miller DCCCXV Group, LLC and Colonel, US Army, Retired).

Kelly's high school career was full and varied! He was in orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, and Choir for four years; attaining first chair bass for Orchestra for three years, and was named twice to North Dakota All-State Orchestra. Basketball, football and track further broadened Kelly's experiences. He was a multi-year letter winner in track and named co-captain. Roles in theater productions are proof of even more diverse talent. When Kelly graduated

from South High, he had a strong academic background (sixth in his class of 366), breadth and depth in skills and a four-year Army ROTC scholarship to UND.

Kelly graduated from UND summa cum laude with a degree in public/police administration and with several honors related to his time with the ROTC program. The Army recognize Kelly's academic potential and awarded him a fully funded fellowship to pursue a degree in Latin American Studies at Tulane University, where he also graduated with honors.

Kelly's military career has included Platoon Leader of the Military Police, Company Commander of Military Police; team chief of the Haiti Working Group in the National Military Joint Intelligence Center; U.S. Military Defense Attache to Port au Prince, Haiti; and Senior Faculty Member, Joint Military Attache School, Defense Intelligence Agency. Kelly has received innumerable military awards and decorations and is credited as having positively impacted U.S. Policy through his unassailable character and professional instruction. As a civilian, Kelly continues his service as a consultant to the Defense Attache School and serves as a high school baseball umpire!

WARD MUSCATELL - CLASS OF 1979

As a three-year letterman on the Bruin football team, Ward Muscatell was a major contributor to the first South High State championship in 1978. He was voted "Most Valuable Defensive Lineman" for both his junior and senior years. A 175-pound nose guard, Ward had 48 unassisted tackles and 102 assisted tackles, which was likely why he was named to the All-Conference Football team in 1977 and 1978. Teammate, Paul Honl disclosed that Ward was not a big guy but "he made up for it with his speed and tenacity."

Honorary Muscatell family member, Marcia Urban, had her own ideas about Ward and football. "To say that Ward loves football is insufficient. It is part of his DNA, like breathing. I've enjoyed that many stories told of FSH football, his coaches exploits and the big State Championship game, as he mentors his sons



and many grandsons in the sport."

Ward went to Jamestown College for a year, playing defensive nose guard before transferring to Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Florida to study Business Management. A predictive move considering that Ward would fully immerse himself in the automotive industry.

As a salesperson, manager, or dealer Ward became fluent in all things, Toyota, Chrysler, Dodge-Jeep, Eagle, Kia, and Subaru. As Chief Executive Officer of Muscatell Automotive, Ward accrued several top dealer awards. Four years in a row, Ward was presented with the Subaru Community Commitment Award, which recognizes dealers who provide exceptional service and demonstrate outstanding dedication to supporting the causes in their communities.

Craig Richie, longtime friend shared, "He has been exceedingly successful in his career, as he cares more about others than he cares about his own well-being. This has served not only him well but, more importantly, everyone around him. He exemplifies what a true Christian man should be. He walks the walk!"



JEFF KOLPACK - CLASS OF 1982

Language Arts instructor, Gelaine Orvik hit it right out of the park when he shared that Jeff "was an outstanding writer at that time and he dreamed of his being a superb writer." Jeff is an award-winning journalist with 37 years of experience covering breaking news and writing features and columns on multimedia platforms that include newspaper, digital newspaper, radio and television shows, podcasts and video blogs.

Jeff's career game plan may have hit its stride when he slid into South High. Jeff played basketball (claiming the Chuck Dawson Award for Best Team Player), was a member of National Honor Society and played American Legion baseball. He has his eye on the ball and his future when he became part of the South High journalism staff. Jeff attended NDSU for Mass Communication, a foreshadowing, for sure!

Jeff honed his journalistic talents working for the Jamestown Sun, The Bismarck Tribune, The Forum and WDAY. He has covered NDSU athletics, specifically football and basketball, from 1995 to the present; eight Virgil Hill world light heavyweight title fights; the 1999 Pan American Games in Winnipeg; four NCAA Division I men's basketball tournament games, the 2016 NFL Draft in Chicago; all 20 Fargo Marathons; the 2023 U.S. Women's Open at Pebble Beach; and was known for breaking the story on NDSU moving to Division I. Jeff continues to co-host "Bison Gameday" on WDAY-TV, the "Bison Post-Game Show" on InForum.com and hosts/produces "The Golf Show with Jeff Kolpack." Jeff has also authored several books.

The Forum Editor-in-Chief, Matthew Von Pinnon stated, "Despite routinely rubbing elbows with future NFL stars and other high-profile figures and celebrities, Kolpack always remains down to earth and

FARGO NORTH HIGH SCHOOL 2025 HALL OF FAME RECIPIENTS



Membership in the **North High School Hall of Fame** consists of graduates, advisors/coaches, and other individuals who have made exceptional contributions to North High School.



ANDY DAHLEN - FACULTY

Andy Dahlen served as the lead principal of Fargo North High School from 1994 to 2021, guiding the school through nearly three decades of academics, culture, and facility advancements. A native of Mabel, Minnesota, Dahlen graduated from Mabel-Canton High School in 1977, where he was a three-sport letter winner. He went on to earn a bachelor's degree in mathematics education with a coaching minor from the University of North Dakota in 1981. As a member of the UND football team, he was a four-year letter winner, team captain in 1980, two-time All-Conference selection, a member of the UND All Century Team, and an inductee into the UND Hall of Fame. He later earned a master's degree in education administration from UND in 1990.

Before coming to Fargo North, Dahlen taught mathematics and coached in Grand Forks for eight years, served as the Grand Forks Athletic Director for three years and was Associate Principal at Grand Forks Central High School for two years. He managed numerous NDHSAA regional state tournaments, including hockey, basketball, swimming, tennis, and track and field. As Fargo North, Dahlen hired hundreds of teachers and staff, oversaw major building projects including the early 2000's remodel and the 2006 classroom addition, and led the school's transition to a comprehensive four-year high school. He implemented Professional Learning Communities, the Senior Retreat, Academy Program, Academic Wall of Honor, and multiple student support initiatives. Under his leadership, the number of students passing AP exams tripled in three years. He also served on the NDHSAA Board of Directors from 2014-17, including as President in 2017, and was named FPS Administrator of the Year in 2021.

Since retiring, Dahlen has served as Choice ready Manager for the Fargo Public Schools and consulted with West Fargo Public Schools to expand student readiness initiatives statewide. He and his wife, Renee, have three children, all Fargo North graduates, and five grandchildren.

JAKE LABER - CLASS OF 2004

Jake Laber, a 2004 graduate of Fargo North High School, is remembered as an outstanding student-athlete and an even better person. The son of Ken and Deb Laber, Jake grew up in North Fargo, attending Washington Elementary School, Horace Mann Elementary School, Ben Franklin Middle School, and Fargo North. He graduated with an exceptional academic record, earning only one "B" in his high school career, while excelling in baseball and basketball. As a pitcher for the Spartan baseball team and a guard on the basketball team, Jake's talent and leadership were evident.



Following graduation, Jake attended North Dakota State University on both baseball and business scholarships, earning a degree in accounting in 2008. As a starting pitcher for the Bison, he was a cornerstone of the program and represented his school with excellence. His summer baseball career included two seasons in the Northwoods League with the Thunder Bay Border Cats and two seasons in the Frontier League with the River City Rascals in O'Fallon, Missouri.

Jake's professional baseball career began when he signed with the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks, where he

pitched for more than five seasons before retiring in 2014. His number 19 was retired by both Post 2 American Legion Baseball - where the bullpen is named in his honor - and by the FM RedHawks, a testament to his impact on the game and the community.

After baseball, Jake began a career in finance and accounting and was engaged to be married when he passed away unexpectedly on August 14, 2016. Known for his kindness, compassion, and positive influence, Jake left a lasting legacy with his family, friends, and countless others in the baseball community.



CANDACE SHULTZ - FACULTY

Candace "Candy" Shultz served as a counselor at Fargo North High School for 33 1/2 years, from 1980 until her retirement in 2013. A native of Buffalo, North Dakota, she graduated from Buffalo High School in 1970, earned a bachelor's degree in education from North Dakota State University in 1974, and taught in LaMoure, North Dakota, for two years, before completing her master's degree in counseling at NDSU. She also worked at Villa Nazareth, a residential treatment facility in Fargo, before joining the North High counseling staff.

Throughout her career, Shultz worked with approximately 300 students each year, providing personal, academic, and career counseling. She

served as department chair, coordinated testing programs, and advised the wrestling cheerleaders and Student Council. She played a central role in planning and decorating for many junior-senior proms. Known for her dedication, warmth, and professionalism, Shultz was deeply respected by students, parents, and colleagues alike.

Since retiring, she has embraced volunteerism, including work at a preschool and active involvement in her church. She enjoys traveling, gardening, quilting, researching family history, and most of all, spending time with her family - especially attending her grandsons' hockey and baseball games.

Shultz and her husband, David, were married in 1984 and have two daughters: Chelsea (Mike Monda) of Fargo, with sons Layton and Emmett; and Taylor (Kevin Lee) of St. Paul, Minnesota, with daughters Lydia and Ruby. She credits her fellow counselors and the dedicated staff and administrators at Fargo North for influencing and inspiring her work throughout her career.

JUSTIN WELK - CLASS OF 2006

Justin Welk, a 2006 graduate of Fargo North High School, is a leader in human resources and organizational development whose roots remain firmly planted in the Fargo North community.

He is the son of Keith ('77) and Vicki ('78) Welk, and the brother of Kelsey ('04) Welk Dardis. Welk lives in the Twin Cities with his wife, Molly, and their son, Sullivan.

At North, Welk was an active and accomplished student. He served as a DECA Chapter Officer for three years, was the North Dakota State Vice President in 2004-05, State President in 2005-06, and a candidate for International President in 2006. He was a member of the National Honor Society, Junior Classical League, Activity Leadership Council, and numerous volunteer initiatives through DECA. Welk was also a captain in the varsity hockey team his senior year.



After High School, Welk attending the University of Minnesota - Twin Cities, before earning his

bachelor's degree in marketing from North Dakota State University in 2010. He began his career at Sundog in Fargo, then completed a master's degree in human resources and organizational development from the University of St. Thomas in 2015. His professional path has included HR leadership roles at Target, and currently, as Senior Director of HR Consulting and Learning Development at ICF, a global consulting and technology services company.

Welk has remained connected to DECA, mentoring students, supporting competitive events, and earning the ND DECA Honorary Life Membership Award. His commitment to leadership development extends beyond work, as he continues to inspire young leaders through his involvement with FNH DECA and other organizations.




FARGO SOUTH CLASS OF 1986 40 YEAR CLASS REUNION





