# **RE:** Joint Statement from Participating Nations Regarding the BC Clean Energy Act

**WHEREAS** the UBCIC Chiefs Council asserts that the Title and Rights of the respective Nations have never been ceded;

WHEREAS the Government of British Columbia is attempting to pass the Clean Energy Act;

**WHEREAS** a number of First Nations' recommendations in the Green Energy Task Force report were meant to ensure that Indigenous interests were incorporated into the proposed act;

**WHEREAS** the Government of British Columbia ignored nearly all of the First Nations recommendations in the Green Energy Task Force report and failed to consult First Nations on the Clean Energy Act;

**WHEREAS** the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples confirms that the free, prior and informed consent of Indigenous Peoples must be achieved prior to any decisions that will impact their communities;

**WHEREAS** on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2010, 47 First Nations signed a Joint Statement from Participating Nations Regarding the BC Clean Energy Act calling for the Clean Energy Act to be delayed for at least 6 months until adequate consultation and accommodation of our Rights, Title and interests occurs; and

**WHEREAS** an All Chiefs meeting has been called for June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at Chief Joe Mathias Hall to discuss the impacts of the Clean Energy Act and to develop a coordinated action plan;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council has reviewed and supports the attached May 19, 2010 Joint Statement from Participating Nations Regarding the BC Clean Energy Act;

**THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council reminds the British Columbia government that the land question remains unresolved in British Columbia, and that resource revenue sharing, joint decision making and joint planning must occur with regard to the Clean Energy Act;

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council directs the UBCIC Executive and staff to work with First Nations, the First Nations Summit, BC Assembly of First Nations, the BC First Nations Energy and Mining Council and like-minded organizations to ensure their interests are addressed.

**WHEREAS** Aboriginal Title and Aboriginal and Treaty Rights continue to exist in British Columbia;

**WHEREAS** the First Nations of British Columbia never surrendered jurisdiction over our lands and resources;

**WHEREAS** the 2005 New Relationship statement agrees to establish processes and institutions for shared decision-making about the land and resources and for revenue and benefit sharing. It agrees to a new government-to-government relationship based on respect, recognition and accommodation of aboriginal title and rights;

**WHEREAS** the BC government has recently held first reading of the Clean Energy Act. This Act represents the future direction for green energy production and exports. This act was constructed without First Nations involvement and there was no consultation prior to the introduction of the Act. We are told the Act was guided by a Green Energy Task Force however upon review of the legislation it is clear that the majority of the First Nations recommendations were ignored;

**WHEREAS** the Clean Energy Act exempts significant major hydro and transmission projects from oversight by the BC Utilities Commission; and

**WHEREAS** the provincial Crown has unilaterally implemented these sweeping changes ignoring the court-recognized legal obligations for meaningful consultation and accommodation in the development of the Clean Energy Act.

# We, the assembled Nations from across British Columbia speak with one voice to say:

- **1.** We call upon the BC government to amend the proposed Act and incorporate all recommendations that support First Nations involvement in clean energy opportunities.
- 2. We call upon the Premier and Cabinet to immediately engage in a discussion with First Nations leaders to work out a solution to incorporate our recommendations.
- **3.** We call upon the BC government to delay the bill until adequate consultation and accommodation with First Nations occurs.

# RE: All Chiefs Assembly May 18-20, 2010 – Draft Action Plan

**WHEREAS** at an All-Chiefs' Assembly held in August 2009, an All-Chiefs' Task Force was struck to map out a six-month action plan to: raise awareness of recognition of First Nations Title and Rights at provincial, national and international levels; and, to better organize ourselves internally as First Nations in British Columbia to work together on issues of common concern;

**WHEREAS** the All-Chiefs' Task Force Action Plan was supported by First Nations Chiefs and leaders in BC through resolution of the First Nations Summit (resolution #1109.13), BC Assembly of First Nations (resolution #12/2009), and Union of BC Indian Chiefs (resolution #2009.54);

**WHEREAS** at the All-Chiefs' Assembly held on May 18-20, 2010, the All-Chief's Task Force reported on their work to date in implementing their Action Plan, and presented recommendations for further efforts to November 2010;

**WHEREAS** at the All-Chiefs' Assembly held on May 18-20, 2010, the First Nations Chiefs and leaders in attendance developed a "phase two" draft "Action Plan" based on the recommendations of the All-Chiefs' Task Force;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council affirms their support for the March 17, 2005 Leadership Accord and the First Nations Leadership Council;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council supports the attached "ALL-CHIEFS ASSEMBLY (MAY 18-20, 2010) – DRAFT "ACTION PLAN"";

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council calls upon the All-Chiefs' Task Force to continue its efforts to further refine and coordinate the implementation of the Action Plan until November 2010; **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council calls upon the Union BC Indian Chiefs Executive to work closely with the All-Chiefs' Task Force in the implementation of the Action Plan;

**THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council calls upon the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Executive to work with the All-Chiefs' Task Force in seeking new resources to implement the "ALL-CHIEFS ASSEMBLY (MAY 18-20, 2010) – DRAFT "ACTION PLAN"";

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council calls upon the All-Chiefs' Task Force to report regularly to First Nations leaders on progress in further developing and implementing the Action Plan, including at meetings of the BC Assembly of First Nations, First Nations Summit, and Union of BC Indian Chiefs.

# RE: Support for Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council Legal Battle to Establish First Nation Rights to an Economic Fishery

**WHEREAS** since time immemorial, the Nuu-chah-nulth have built their societies, economies and culture around fishing and have been stewards of their ocean resources;

**WHEREAS** on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2009, Nuu-chah-nulth Nations won a major legal victory in the British Columbia Supreme Court, in the fight to have a constitutionally protected Aboriginal Right to fish for commercial purposes. In *Ahousat Indian Band and Nation v. Canada (Attorney General)* Madam Justice Garson ruled that the Nuu-chah-nulth peoples have an Aboriginal Right to fish for any species of fish in their territories, and to sell fish. Further, Madam Justice Garson ruled that the *Fisheries Act* and regulations made pursuant to the *Act* infringe the Aboriginal Right of the Nuu-chah-nulth peoples to fish and to sell fish;

**WHEREAS** after more than a decade of legal preparations, *Ahousat Indian Band and Nation v. Canada* was brought to the courts by the Ehattesaht, Mowachaht/Muchalaht, Hesquiaht, Ahousat and Tla-o-quiaht First Nations;

**WHEREAS** the B.C. Supreme Court directed the parties to consult and negotiate the manner in which the plaintiffs' Aboriginal Rights to fish and sell fish can be accommodated and exercised. The Court also directed that if consultations and negotiations are not successful after two years, then Canada has leave to apply at a subsequent trial to tender further evidence on the issue of justification;

**WHEREAS** Canada has chosen to appeal the November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2009 decision of the British Columbia Supreme Court that established economic rights-based fisheries for these five Nuu-chah-nulth Nations;

**WHEREAS** these five Nuu-chah-nulth Nations need the financial and moral support of all First Nations in British Columbia and Canada in order to secure victory through the B.C. Court of Appeal;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council fully supports the Nuuchah-nulth Tribal Council in their ongoing legal battle with Department of Fisheries and Oceans to firmly establish First Nation rights to an economic fishery;

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council directs the UBCIC Executive and staff to work with the First Nations Summit, BC Assembly of First Nations and like-minded organizations, to work with and support the Nuu-chah-nulth in their ongoing legal battle.

# **RE: UBCIC Constitution Committee Continuation of Work and Date for Special Assembly**

**WHEREAS** at the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Annual General Assembly in September 2009, the Constitution Committee was struck through UBCIC Resolution 2009-45 to "review the UBCIC Constitution and Bylaws" to develop:

- A Renewal Plan that considers: Priority Setting, Strategic Planning and Budgeting; Conduct of Union of BC Indian Chiefs meetings; Resolutions Management Process; and the structure of the Union of BC Indian Chiefs' Executive; and
- The Renewal Plan will provide milestones ensuring the UBCIC leadership are actively engaged in this renewal process and clear direction to ensure implementation of duly accepted recommendations;

**WHEREAS** at the UBCIC Chiefs Council in March 2010, UBCIC Resolution 2010-04 directed the Committee to continue its review work and to ensure the incorporation of feedback by the Grand Chiefs that were in attendance at the founding of UBCIC in 1969, the current Executive Members and full and active members of the UBCIC;

**WHEREAS** the Constitution Committee has provided an update to the UBCIC Chiefs Council, and sought feedback and input from the Chiefs Council and the current Executive Members, and is currently in the process of seeking input from the Grand Chiefs as well as full and active members of the UBCIC;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** the UBCIC Chiefs Council supports the continuation of the Constitution Committee's work until September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council recommends that the draft mandate statement includes language around the implementation and exercise of our Aboriginal Title and Rights;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council recommends that the Constitution Committee consider in their work ways to address the working relationship of the UBCIC with the First Nations Summit and the BC Assembly of First Nations to ensure coordination of efforts where necessary or beneficial;

**THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council directs the Constitution Committee to ensure that any draft amendments/extraordinary resolutions/policy changes be provided one month in advance of the September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010 Special Assembly as per Section 15 of the UBCIC Constitution and Bylaws for the consideration of the Chiefs Council;

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council sets Tuesday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010, the day before the UBCIC Annual General Assembly, as the day for a Special Assembly to have the Constitution Committee present their completed work of draft amendments/resolutions/policy changes for the consideration of the UBCIC Chiefs in Special Assembly.

# **RE:** First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council Established Permanently

**WHEREAS** during the second Indigenous Child at the Centre forum in July 2008, a "One Heart, One Mind: Statement of Solidarity and Cooperation" was signed by First Nations leaders, and it supported the establishment of the Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council with the mandate to:

- i. Amend the Indigenous Child at the Centre Action Plan to reflect input from community, frontline workers and leadership;
- ii. Develop a workplan to advance and implement the Indigenous Child at the Centre Action Plan; and
- iii. Develop the Terms of Reference for the First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council;

**WHEREAS** by resolution 2008-29, the Union of BC Indian Chiefs endorsed the "Walking Together to Keep Indigenous Children at the Centre" Declaration of Commitment, and in July 2008 the Union of BC Indian Chiefs signed the "One Heart, One Mind" Statement of Solidarity and Cooperation"; by Resolution 2009-06, the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council endorsed the mandate and terms of reference for the Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council; and by Resolution 2009-38, the Union of BC Indian Chiefs-in-Assembly endorsed the Indigenous Child at the Centre Action Plan;

**WHEREAS** on March 2-3, 2010, the Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council hosted the third Indigenous Child at the Centre Forum. At that Forum, delegates reviewed the work of the Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council and made the following recommendations:

- i. To lift the word 'interim' from the 'Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council';
- ii. To continue the work of the First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council as a Nationdriven process; and,
- iii. To establish First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council working groups on issues related to governance, funding, and indigenizing practice standards;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council supports the recommendations arising from the third Indigenous Child at the Centre Forum to:

- a. Lift the word 'interim' from the 'Interim First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council';
- b. Continue the work of the First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council as a Nationdriven process; and,
- c. Establish First Nations Child and Family Wellness Council working groups on issues related to governance, funding, and indigenizing practice standards.

# **RE:** Support of Aboriginal Community Futures Ongoing Funding

**WHEREAS** Community Futures (CFs) provide business loans, training, mentoring and assistance, community economic development assistance and support to those areas of Canada that are experiencing a higher than the national average unemployment rate, single industry dependence, economic downturns, lack infrastructure to attract business as well as low annual income levels;

WHEREAS The Federal Government supports 273 CFs throughout Canada with 34 of those operating in BC;

WHEREAS of the only 25 CFs in Canada that are First Nations, three are in BC;

**WHEREAS** the Federal government has only extended the existing CF operating contracts to the end of March 2011 with no certainty of the future of CF's beyond that period; and

WHEREAS the First Nations CF's in BC have made a significant positive impact in the areas they serve.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs supports continuing funding to the First Nations Community Futures at the present level or higher with multi-year contracts;

**THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Federal Government support the development of at least two (2) new First Nations Community Futures in BC, one in southern BC and one in northern BC, as the existing non-First Nations Community Futures do not serve our communities;

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that this be communicated to Minister for Western Diversification Lynne Yelich, Minister of Indian and Northern Affairs Chuck Strahl and to the BC Legislature.

# **RE: Support for Legal Challenge to Implementation of HST**

**WHEREAS** Indigenous Peoples in their respective territories confirm and defend their Aboriginal Title, Rights, ownership and jurisdiction over the lands and resources;

**WHEREAS** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs is mandated to protect, defend and maintain Indigenous selfdetermination and Indigenous land rights;

**WHEREAS** as Indigenous Peoples exercising our sovereignty, First Nations in B.C. have the right to tax and B.C. infringed this right to tax implicit to sovereign governments by excluding First Nations from the unilateral decision to impose the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST);

**WHEREAS** the HST stands to greatly increase the poverty of First Nations living in B.C. Our collective poverty is of unique relevance to the imposition of HST, as it is the result of historic, institutionalized injustice and seizure of our land and ability to exercise our culture and governance;

**WHEREAS** by Resolution 2009-41, the UBCIC Chiefs in Assembly supported work regarding the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) and related tax matters, including:

- 1. Directing the UBCIC Executive to raise concerns with the provincial and federal governments calling for meaningful consultation and accommodation around the implementation of HST and the Comprehensive Integrated Tax Co-ordination Agreement (CITCA);
- 2. Striking a representative Chiefs Committee that seeks resources and produces a report on HST and BC First Nations, and a paper analyzing other adverse tax policies affecting BC First Nations;

**WHEREAS** by Resolution 2009-51, the UBCIC Chiefs in Council nominated and appointed Chief Don Moses, Chief Keith Matthew, and Chief Mike LeBourdais to the HST Committee;

**WHEREAS** in September 2009, the HST Committee began efforts to engage the provincial and federal Ministries of Finance, and commissioned a report on HST and BC First Nations. The HST Committee made a presentation to the Senate Standing Committee on Finance during hearings on Bill C-62, An Act to Amend the Excise Tax, and has done several press releases speaking out against the imposition of HST;

**WHEREAS** the Union of BC Indian Chiefs continues to seek a meeting with the provincial and federal finance ministers to advocate for consultation and accommodation with BC First Nations around implementation of HST;

**WHEREAS** the Fight HST campaign in BC has been dedicated to repealing the HST tax throughout BC, and;

**WHEREAS** as part of the Fight HST campaign, Bill Vander Zalm launched a Citizen's Initiative petition against the HST on April 6, 2010, and has successfully met the threshold of collecting the signatures of 10 per cent of registered voters in each of the province's 85 ridings, and these signatures will be verified by Elections BC after July 5;

**WHEREAS** the Fight HST Campaign will ultimately consider a legal challenge to the HST if necessary, on the basis that the HST contravenes the Constitution Act 1867 and the Excise Tax Act;

**WHEREAS** an HST Panel, consisting of Chief Keith Matthew, Cliff Atleo, Bill Vander Zalm, Chris Delaney and Merle Alexander, presented to and answered questions at the Chiefs Council meeting of June 2010.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council directs the HST Committee and UBCIC Executive to continue the HST work as set out in Resolution 2009-41;

**THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council directs the Union of BC Indian Chiefs HST Committee and Union of BC Indian Chiefs Executive to work with the Fight HST Campaign and other like-minded organizations to continue publicizing impacts of the HST on First Nations in B.C.;

**THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Union of BC Indian Chiefs Council supports the Fight HST campaign in exploring legal options, including a constitutional challenge to the implementation of the HST.
