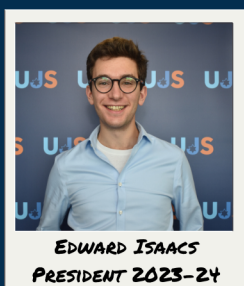

I am proud to be leading this great organisation for the coming year. And I hope I can count on your support, to join me in ensuring the future of the Jewish community for many years to come.



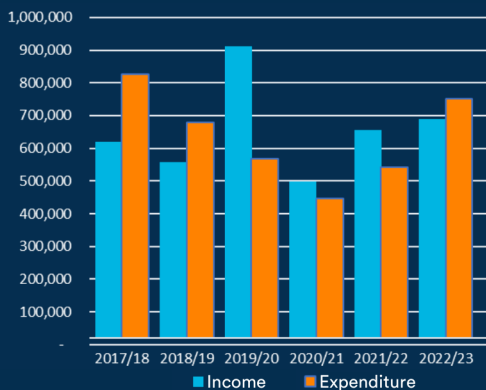

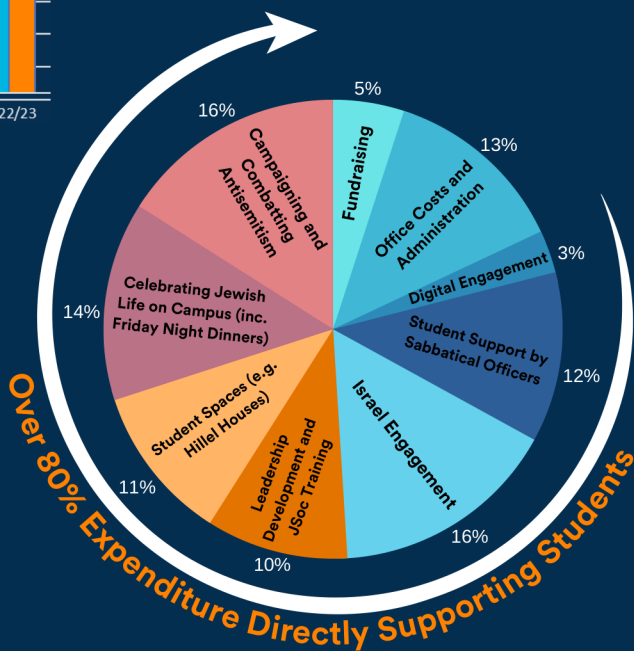
# Finance Data

UJS has been gradually recovering from the fundraising and delivery challenges of COVID (March 2019-June 2021) and received a significant legacy donation in early 2020, which has been held in reserves. The Trustees decided to use a limited amount of these reserves to expand our support for JSocs and Jewish students. We now support 75 societies, up from 68 pre-COVID, and aim to become a £1 million+ organisation by summer 2025 through focused fundraising, in order to increase the delivery and capability of Jewish Societies across the UK and Ireland.

Our spending is entirely dedicated to benefitting Jewish students and, due to diligent spending, UJS has been able to keep productivity high, delivering exceptional events, development and support, whilst ensuring spending is kept to a sensible level.
