
LEBANON MOBILE CLINIC

Project Overview

In 2024, amid the ongoing war in Lebanon, the healthcare system lacks the structural capacity to respond to crises, hindering healthcare workers' ability to provide primary healthcare (PHC) service provision efficiently.

Through this project, UOSSM Canada is working to enhance healthy lives, promote resilience and well-being equally for the displaced Syrian and Lebanese populations within Lebanon. Our work is to improve access to acceptable, inclusive, and quality essential healthcare services; by providing primary healthcare in 11 temporary shelters for those most vulnerable and in need in the Bekaa region, affected by the Lebanese Israeli conflict.

The project is focused on offering medical care, performing preventive health practices, delivering Psychosocial Support Services (PSS), and referrals of specialized advanced cases.



MALES

Duration: 3 months

3-Month Reach: The target is to reach a total of 5,766 beneficiaries, divided as follows; 3,230 medical consultations, 250 beneficiaries of Psychosocial Support Services (PSS) per month, 1,650 beneficiaries of awareness-raising sessions, and 636 beneficiaries receiving hygiene and personal care kits.

Realized 2-month target: This project started in November 2024, and has since then provided 2,219 medical consultations for 2,103 patients, 62% of whom are female, 318 PSS sessions, and 400 beneficiaries received hygiene and personal care kits.



Almasa's Remarkable Story of Resilience and Hope!

At first, Almasa was hesitant to engage with the shelter's support services, overwhelmed by her own struggles, and fearing the unknown. She initially declined group sessions but began to trust the staff as she spent more time in the shelter. Slowly, she opened up about her emotional challenges—fatigue, sadness, and worry about her husband's health condition. The team listened and took action, they reassured her, and connected her with medical services for her husband; which helped ease some of her anxiety.

Encouraged by their support, she started to join the group sessions, there she found strength in the shared experiences of others. Over time, she became more involved, volunteering in the kitchen and participating more actively in sessions. The team's care and guidance transformed her, and with her husband's surgery successfully arranged, her sense of hope, relief and confidence grew.

Ahmad's Inspiring Journey to Health and Happiness!

Ahmad, a child at the FFC shelter, faced a life-changing accident that left him fully paralyzed. Initially, he withdrew from activities, worried about how others would perceive his wheelchair and condition. The protection team recognized the need to rebuild his self-confidence and educate the other children. With patience, they encouraged Ahmad to participate in activities at his own pace while also engaging his parents to support his emotional growth.

They organized awareness sessions for the other children to foster understanding and inclusion. Over time, Ahmad began to join in, and the children, now more empathetic, welcomed him into their games.

Today, Ahmad is an active and integral part of the shelter community, and his journey highlights the power of inclusion and support in helping children overcome challenges. "AFTER THE ACCIDENT, AHMAD WAS

LIBYA SPECIALIZED CLINICS

Project Overview

In response to the devastating situation in northeastern Libya following Storm Daniel a critical humanitarian intervention has been launched to provide urgent healthcare support to the affected population, particularly in the eastern region of Libya's communities.

Through this project, UOSSM Canada aims to improve healthcare services for the flood-affected population in Derna and surrounding areas.

The project is to support a Primary Health Center by deployment of healthcare providers specialized in Trauma & Orthopedics, Diagnostic Radiology, and Ophthalmology. Additionally, medication and baby formula has been provided addressing the immediate healthcare needs of vulnerable individuals impacted by the floods.




Duration: 3 months

3-Month Reach: The targeted reach is 1500 beneficiaries.

Realized 2 month target: The project started in November 2024, and has since provided 2,952 medical services, supporting 1,006 patients; with 49% female, 51% male, and 48% children under the age of 18.































LIBYA SPECIALIZED CLINICS

Mohamed's Recovery Story!

After surviving Hurricane Daniel, Mohamed injured his knee while clearing debris, leading to severe osteoarthritis and crippling pain. The injury affected his mobility and made it difficult to work, deepening his financial struggles. With no means to afford private treatment, he feared his condition would worsen.

Then, a mobile medical team arrived, offering free care. Mohamed received a timely diagnosis and began treatment, including medication and physiotherapy. With follow-up care, he regained strength, mobility, and the ability to work again. Today, Mohamed walks without pain and is able to support his family once more, while continuing his medical progress.

Fatima's Story, A Better Vision!

Fatima lost her husband and home during Hurricane Daniel, forcing her to live with relatives in overcrowded conditions. Her deteriorating vision due to cataracts made daily tasks nearly impossible, leaving her dependent on others. With no savings and limited access to healthcare, she struggled to find a solution.

When the mobile medical team diagnosed her cataracts, she was quickly referred for free surgery. After the procedure, Fatima regained her vision and a sense of control over her life. She now performs daily activities without assistance and feels empowered to face the challenges of post-disaster recovery.

MOROCCO MOBILE CLINIC

Project Overview

The 6.8 magnitude earthquake that struck central Morocco on September 8, 2023. The earthquake caused severe destruction in the High Atlas Mountains and rural areas south of Marrakech, such as Al Haouz province, areas which had occasional access to healthcare and no medical facilities in over 20 years until the earthquake; highlighting the urgent need for healthcare services and unit. Many buildings were destroyed, including homes made of mud bricks, leaving communities in dire need of medical assistance and humanitarian aid.

In response to this crisis, UOSSM Canada sought out to alleviate the humanitarian suffering of Moroccans in those areas that had occasional access to healthcare and no medical facilities at the time. The project has provided access to life-saving and equitable healthcare, ensuring that assistance is well-coordinated and directed towards the most vulnerable populations in need of vital support. UOSSM Canada is contributing to the delivery of health services by operating a Primary Health Care (PHC) center in Aghbar village and Al Haouz province near Marrakech.

The PHC center provides essential PHC services, both curative and preventive as follows:


- Reproductive Health services
- Child Health services
- Communicable Diseases (CDs) & Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) services for prevention
- Early diagnosis
- Management and treatment of various diseases

Duration: 8 months

(2 month preparation and 6 months operation)

8-Month Reach: Enhanced Primary Health Care in affected communities in Morocco through training 6 health care service providers on infection prevention and control protocol, and expected to provide 4,800 medical consultations.

Realized target: After 2 months of preparation, the operations started near the end of October, approximately providing 1,772 medical consultations and serving 1,307 beneficiaries; 69% of them are female and 31% are males, 45% of them were children between the age of 5 to 18.





MOROCCO MOBILE CLINIC

Omar's Story of Strength and Relief!

Omar had been enduring dizziness for a long time, significantly impacting his quality of life. With no understanding of his condition and unable to afford the lengthy and costly journey to the nearest city for medical attention, he felt trapped in his suffering.

When the health center was established in his area, it transformed his life. After being welcomed and treated by the caring staff, Omar was diagnosed with hypertension. The timely diagnosis and treatment not only resolved his dizziness but also prevented the condition from developing into a severe health crisis that could have threatened his life.

With free medications and regular check-ups offered by the center, Omar feels confident in managing his health. "I feel good now and visit the center from time to time to make sure my health is stable," he shared. This initiative has not only improved his health but also restored his confidence and sense of well-being.


MOROCCO MOBILE CLINIC

Mohamed's Story of Relief and Care!

Mohamed's hearing problem had been a source of distress for years, affecting both his personal and professional life. The significant distance to the nearest hospital made it impossible for him to seek treatment, leaving him to adapt to his condition and resign himself to a life of limited communication and opportunity.

Upon learning about the new health center in his area, Mohamed decided to give it a try. To his surprise, the solution was simple—a routine ear-washing procedure resolved his hearing issues. The center not only restored his hearing but also raised his awareness of the importance of seeking medical attention early, even for minor issues.

"The accessibility of the center has changed everything for us," he said. "I didn't expect the result, but I'm so happy now." With his hearing restored, Mohamed can fully engage with his clients and enjoy life once more.

GAZA WOUND CARE

Project Overview


As of the 23rd of February 2024, Israeli airstrikes and shelling targeted Gaza including residential buildings, health facilities; more than 378 attacks on health care, 12 of the hospitals are currently partially functioning and 61 of the primary health care facilities are not functioning. Large-scale fatalities and casualties were reported exceeding 29,410 fatalities and 69,465 injuries of which approximately 50% are children and women.

UOSSM Canada is providing specialized wound care devices and services to reduce health-related morbidities and mortalities in the Gaza Strip, where most deaths and amputations are caused by wounds and infections. By enhancing the accessibility to quality wound care healthcare services for those most vulnerable and in need in Deir El Balah, and Khan Yunus, and North Gaza governorates through procurement of medical supplies, consumables and the Vacuum-Assisted Closure (VAC) devices which do not require any electricity, saving many from infection and amputations. Alongside these medical equipment and supply, UOSSM Canada is supporting with providing comprehensive healthcare services such as:

- Specialized wound care
- Surgical Interventions
- Expanding Healthcare Access
- Capacity Building of Healthcare Providers

Duration: 6 months

6-Month Reach: Procuring 1,000 VAC devices, and medical supplies/consumables. Installing 550 VAC devices and providing 5,000 medical consultations.

VAC FOR NON-WAR RELATED WOUNDS

Realized 8-month target:

- Procured 1,000 VAC devices, and medical supplies/consumables for over \$900K CAD.
- Provided 273 VAC services for 144 patients while installing 144 VAC devices.
- 7,232 medical consultations and services to beneficiaries of whom 32% are females and 68% are males; 718 Surgical operations were provided.
- 46 Healthcare providers, including nurses and doctors, underwent training on the use of VAC devices and advanced wound care.
- Organized 2 Medical days reaching over 150 displaced individuals and delivering 205 services, offering them vital healthcare that they otherwise could not have received.



Raghad's Remarkable Strength and Wound Recovery!

Raghad Abu Salem, suffered a severe injury to her foot caused by a rocket strike. The injury resulted in deep wounds on the lower part of her foot, which required immediate medical attention. However, the ongoing conflict and challenges in accessing healthcare left Raghad facing significant barriers to proper treatment. For weeks, she had to endure repeated dressing changes without any improvement, while her family struggled with the costs of transportation to the hospital and the shortage of essential medical supplies.

A medical team reached out to Raghad and arranged for the installation of a VAC device, which was used for three treatment sessions. This device helped promote wound healing and with each session, the wound began to close. After significant progress was made, Raghad was referred to the plastic surgery department, where a skin graft was performed to fully close the wound.

The timely intervention greatly improved Raghad's condition reduced her pain and restored her mobility. It also alleviated the financial burden on her family by minimizing the need for repeated hospital visits and reducing the costs associated with ongoing dressing changes and medical supplies.

Adel's Recovery Story!

Adel Sikkek sustained a deep wound below the knee. The injury required specialized care that was initially unavailable. The prolonged dressing changes failed to yield improvement and the lack of medical supplies and proper follow-up led to recurrent infections.

Upon intervention by the project team, Adel underwent two VAC therapy sessions that resulted in marked improvement in the wound's condition. He was then referred to the plastic surgery department, where a skin graft was successfully performed, closing the wound and significantly accelerating his recovery. This comprehensive care not only mitigated the risk of further infections but also improved his overall quality of life.

Cesar's Story, A Child's Wound and Strength!

Cesar Abu Aoukal, a 9-year-old boy, suffered a life-altering injury when shrapnel pierced his lower foot, creating a deep wound that required urgent care. However, due to the challenges of war, his family struggled to access medical treatment. After two weeks of ineffective dressing changes, the risk of amputation became a serious concern.

With the support of the project, Cesar received a multi-stage treatment plan. A Vacuum-Assisted Closure (VAC) device helped reduce the wound size, followed by an external fixation device to stabilize it. In the final stage, a skin graft closed the wound completely. This comprehensive treatment saved his foot, restored his mobility, and gave him hope for the future.


NASSER SPECIALIZED CLINIC: SOUTH GAZA

Project Overview

South Gaza, a region heavily affected by ongoing conflict grappling with a severe humanitarian crisis, faces significant challenges in delivering adequate healthcare services. The prolonged humanitarian crisis has exacerbated existing vulnerabilities, straining the local health infrastructure and overwhelming the capacity of medical facilities.

Through this project, UOSSM Canada is working to enhance healthcare services in South Gaza, especially management of acute and non-acute medical conditions for civilians in the Gaza Strip who are affected by diabetic complications, and war injuries.

The project is achieved through the operation of a specialized clinic offering Outpatient Clinics and Minor Surgical Unit (MSU) focused on vascular care, wound care, and endocrinology, Inpatient unit, physiotherapy services focusing on rehabilitation, mobility enhancement, pain relief, home visits care and capacity building for the health care providers in Southern Gaza.



Duration: 6 months

6-Month Reach: The target reach is 24,150 medical services provided to 2,574 patients.

Realized 2 Months target: The project started in November 2024 providing 14,288 medical services benefiting 707 patients of whom 64% are male, 36% female, and 23% were 65 years and older.



Nujoud's Story of Care and Relief!

On November 29, 2024, Nujoud sought care at the Diabetic Care Clinic at Nasser Medical Complex, presenting with a diabetic wound located below her right knee.

Her vital signs were recorded upon arrival, and blood glucose levels were tested. Laboratory analysis of her complete blood count (CBC) indicated severe anemia, with a hemoglobin level of 7.1 g/dL. The clinic's medical team promptly administered two units of blood to stabilize her condition. Subsequently, Nujoud was admitted to the clinic for wound care and preparation for a surgical procedure.

During her stay, Nujoud benefited from a multidisciplinary approach that included regular blood testing, consistent medical evaluations, and routine wound dressings. This holistic care significantly contrasted with her prior experiences, where overcrowded hospitals lacked the capacity to provide her with the necessary admission and care





Ghassan's Relief and Happiness!

Ghassan has been living with diabetes and hypertension since 2010, which requires continuous management through medication and regular medical check-ups. In 2022, he underwent the amputation of three toes due to complications from his diabetes. This led to the need for specialized care, including frequent wound dressing and medication to prevent further infection.

Prior to the project's intervention, Ghassan faced a lack of essential medical resources, including the unavailability of proper wound care and medications and the absence of clean environments to conduct dressing changes. This was exacerbated by the closure of nearby clinics, which left him without reliable access to healthcare. The project addressed these gaps by setting up a facility that provided daily wound cleaning, proper dressing changes and access to essential medications. The medical team's attention and the provision of a sterile and well-maintained environment contributed to Ghassan's recovery, improving both his physical and mental well-being.

GAZA MENTAL HEALTH & PSYCHOSOCIAL SERVICES (MHPSS)

Project Overview

No doubt armed conflicts and natural disasters cause significant psychological and social suffering to affected populations. The psychological and social impacts of emergencies may be acute in the short term, but they can also undermine the long-term mental health and psychosocial well-being of the affected population. UOSSM Canada seeks to contribute to mitigating the impact of the war crisis on the most affected populations in Rafah Governate and South Gaza by improving their well-being and resilience.


The project supports to improve access to specialized mental health services for waraffected individuals, including children, youth and adults, through key interventions such as:

- Psychotherapeutic Services (individual and group therapy sessions)
- Awareness and Education (group sessions

Realized 7-month target: This project started in June 2024, providing a total of 9,213 psychosocial services; with 72% being females, 28% being males, and 62% of them are children and youth under the age of 18. Providing 7,446 Mental Health awareness and Psychosocial sessions; and 1,747 capacity building and case referrals.





Fathiya's Inspiring Path to Inner Peace!

Fathiya, a 14-year-old girl, faced a severe psychological crisis after surviving a bombing that caused her house to collapse while she was inside. She sustained injuries and experienced the fear and trauma of being buried under the rubble with her family. This harrowing experience led to symptoms of psychological trauma, including sleep and eating disorders and withdrawal from social interaction.

Through a comprehensive psychosocial support program, we provided Fathiya with a safe space to express her feelings.

The sessions incorporated relaxation techniques, free drawing, and group activities to strengthen her social connections. Over time, Fathiya showed gradual improvement in her psychological state, which boosted her confidence and her ability to adapt to her surroundings





W.A Remarkable Journey to Happiness!

W.A, a 42-year-old widow residing in an UNRWA shelter in Khan Younis, faced tremendous challenges after losing her husband in July. He was killed in front of her eyes, leaving her to raise five young daughters alone. In addition to the emotional and financial burden, she faced pressure from her late husband's family, who wanted to take her daughters away from her. However, W.A demonstrated immense psychological resilience by standing her ground and refusing to be separated from her daughters.

Throughout the intervention, I established a trusting relationship with W.A, which allowed her to open up and engage in the activities provided. She discovered a passion for drawing, which became an essential outlet for her emotions. She began participating in various therapeutic activities, including relaxation and deep breathing exercises, which helped alleviate her psychological stress. As a result of the intervention, W.A, became more active, engaged, and optimistic about the future. Her psychological and social well-being improved significantly, and she developed a stronger sense of resilience.

GAZA DIALYSIS: RE-SUPPLYING THE NASSER MEDICAL COMPLEX

Project Overview

The Gaza Strip has been experiencing extensive destruction in all aspects of life since October 7th, leaving it extremely devastated. The WHO has recorded attacks on healthcare facilities, causing the death and injury of healthcare workers and severe damage to hospitals and ambulances. Dialysis sessions have been reduced to a level deemed "insufficient from a therapeutic standpoint," further worsening the chronic health conditions of patients in need of this critical treatment.

This project aims to provide life-saving medical devices and supplies in response to the severe shortage at the Hind Deghma Dialysis Center in Nasser Medical Complex. These essential devices are critically needed by hospitals across the sector. UOSSM Canada seeks to improve conditions for kidney failure patients in the Gaza Strip by ensuring the dialysis center operates with the necessary equipment and resources.

3-Month Reach: Supplying Nasser Medical Complex with 33 Dialysis Machines, expecting to reach 400 patients per month, with each patient receiving 12 sessions per month, resulting in an estimated 4800 sessions per month over 6 months.


