


Climate Care Program

How it works and what you'll learn

The Climate Care Program empowers a 'Climate Champion' in each clinic to work with your team to implement changes that improve environmental sustainability in veterinary practice. You'll learn about the following topics:

- Water for Life: Where our water comes from and the impacts of climate change on our water supply.
 Assess your water use and make simple changes to save money and protect our precious water resources.
- No Time to Waste: What happens to waste and how this contributes to climate change. Learn how to be more efficient at using and disposing of resources to reduce your costs and keep waste out of landfill.
- Energy Efficiency: How our energy use contributes to climate change and understanding energy use in your practice. Implement simple changes to improve your energy efficiency and save money.
- The Power of Renewables: The types of renewable energy and how your practice can purchase, produce, store and use energy from renewable sources. Start reducing your carbon footprint so your practice can eventually become carbon neutral!
 - **Buying for a Better Future:** Introduces the concepts of ethical procurement and the circular economy and explores the buying power of practices and how we can use this to advocate for better products and services.
- Healthcare without Harm: Using anaesthetic gases, pharmaceuticals, disinfectants, and other chemicals to care for your patients and keep your teams safe while minimising their environmental impact.

Some of the positive changes that have been made by Climate Champions...

- √ Flow regulators installed on taps.
- ✓ Rain water tank connected to toilets.
- ✓ Updated protocols for washing laundry, scrubbing packs and scrubbing for surgery.
- Recycling stations implemented in convenient places.
- ✓ Recycling of masks, syringes and fluid bags.
- √ Worm farms installed.
- ✓ Increased signage and information to remind staff about how they can minimise their impact.
- ✓ LED lighting installed.
