- Participants from 21 clinics across Australia –
  ranging from small general practices to specialist
  referral and emergency hospitals were given
  access to a pilot version of the program which
  included the first three topic areas.

## IMPACT EVALUATION September - December 2022

- Focused on the preliminary launch of the program, using the data collected across the 21 participants and other relevant stakeholder and assessment data to assess the project's impact according to its desired purpose, outputs, and outcomes.
- The purpose was to review primary data from program participants (Climate Champions) and practice managers, collected via the inbuilt custom course-related surveys along with additional surveys collected from both program participants and their practice managers or owners.
- Data from across the surveys and focus groups found significant positive results around the program design, approach, and delivery.

#### LAUNCH

#### February - May 2023

- The Climate Care Program was officially released via soft launch to our database in February.
   Registration is now open to all Australian veterinary practices.
- The soft launch allowed our team to time onboarding of new clinics with the release and finalisation of evaluation recommendations and allow the team time to stay on top of any issues that may occur as we test the program in a "live" environment for the first time.
- We are pleased to report that there have been no issues with the administrative systems, and new participants are beginning to move through the program pathway.

### PARTNERSHIPS

- We've negotiated a number of marketing partnerships to promote the CCP including with AVA, VNCA, Lincoln Institute, Vet Answers, and others! This has been a great way to raise awareness and attract participants to the Program.
- Three new Program sponsors have come on board to support the CCP. These are Number-one Australia, Lyka Pet Food, and Heska Australia.
- Aust. Environmental Grantmaker Network (AEGN) members have recently donated over \$68,000 to support the 'mobilisation of the CCP'.

#### NEXT STEPS

- AEGN funding has enabled commencement of recruitment for a Head of Marketing & Communications. This new role will focus on promotion of the CCP over the coming 12 months, as well as other member communications, managing our Social Media volunteers, and updates to our website.
- Fundraising is now underway for vital mobilisation activities, including marketing and promotion.
   \$50,000 is our target fundraising goal.
