

Access Key for Young Workers Centre – November Solidarity Night 2024

TikTok Workshop

Date and time: 6-7:30pm Tuesday 19th November



Venue: Victorian Trades Hall Council, 54 Victoria St, Carlton.

We will be in the Nallei Jerring room which is on level 2 of the rear building. Don't worry, we'll have signage and people to direct you!

Getting there:

Victorian Trades Hall Council is located on the corner of Lygon St and Victoria St in Carlton South. Trades Hall is a 600-metre walk from Melbourne Central Station, or accessible by trams along Swanston Street or the 86 or 96 with a short walk. Melbourne Central tram stop is wheelchair accessible. The 200 and 207 bus lines stop directly outside Trades Hall.

There is limited on-street parking around Lygon St and Victoria St. We suggest planning in advance and carefully checking the parking limitations.

Entering the venue

You may enter Trades Hall through the main Lygon St entrance or Victoria St entrance. The entrance to Trades Hall on Victoria Street has several steps and no lift. The entrance through Lygon street has a wheelchair lift which Young Workers Centre staff can be on hand to assist with operating so the event can be wheelchair accessible. There will be signs directing where to go and staff on the day to ask any questions to. At the venue

The room will be heated/cooled depending on weather and have air purifiers. There will be seats and tables to sit and stand around.

Toilets

There are gender-neutral and accessible toilets upstairs near Solidarity Hall. There are also toilets down the hall from the room and through the loading bay. There are wheelchair accessible gender-neutral toilet downstairs and upstairs next to the lift. The cubicles do not have automatic doors and will need to be opened via a handle. The wheelchair accessible toilet has handrails. Baby change facilities are also available on floor 2.

The event

The first half of the session will be dedicated to two speakers, Wil Strake and Alec Farrow, talking about their experience using TikTok to deliver a message. The second half will be dedicated to some activities designed to set you up for success when creating your own campaign TikToks. The sessions will be interactive and will include the opportunity to speak with others and have input into discussion. If you need to step to aside or outside the room at any point you are welcome to do so.
