**SUBJECT:** Item 8: Fund Balance Report

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the Watershed Conservation Authority Governing Board receive and file the Fund Balance Report.

**BACKGROUND:** Attached as Exhibit A is the FY 24/25 Fund Balance Report with balances as of June 30, 2025.

Key changes in the Fund Balance Report are summarized below:

- 1. Accounts with a fund balance change greater than \$1,000 include: V15, V19, V20, V46, V52, V64, V66, V2B, and V2D.
- 2. V15/JPA General Fund: The decrease in the fund balance is primarily due to administrative and labor charges from the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller's Office, as well as a temporary transfer of funds to support project management-related expenses related to the Community Connection to Wildlands project. The Authority anticipates that the funds will be reimbursed in the second quarter of FY2025/26.
- 3. V19/River Park Operations: The decrease in the fund balance is primarily due to a temporary transfer of funds to cover project management-related expenses for the River Park House project. The Authority anticipates that the funds will be reimbursed in the second quarter of FY2025/26. This impact was partially offset by deposits received from leaseholders.
- 4. V20/El Encanto Operations: The decrease in the fund balance is mainly due to the operational expenses. However, this decrease was partially offset by deposits received from tenants and leaseholders.
- 5. V46/River Park Remediation: The decrease in the fund balance is due to a temporary transfer of funds to cover project management-related expenses for the Azusa Wilderness Park Entry project. The transfer is expected to be reversed in July 2025.
- 6. V52/Various Projects: The fund balance increased due to receipt of reimbursement requests from the River Park River Center Development project. However, this increase was partially offset by payroll, administrative, and project management expenses related to the Mount Baldy Wilderness Preserve Fuel Modification and Community Connection to Wildland projects. While advance funding for these projects had been deposited in the prior month, the actual expenses were occurred in June 2025.

- 7. V64/River Park Trail/Phase 1: The decrease in the fund balance is a result of a temporary transfer of funds to cover project management-related expenditures expenses for the Azusa Wilderness Park Entry project. The transfer is expected to be reversed in July 2025.
- 8. V66/USFS Project: The decrease in the fund balance is a result of a temporary transfer of funds to cover project management-related expenditures for the River Park River Center Development project. The transfer is expected to be reversed in July 2025.
- 9. V2B/ San Gabriel Valley Greenway Network Strategic Implementation Plan: The increase in the fund balance is primarily attributed to interest earned during June 2025.
- 10. V2D/ RMC Subvention: The increase in the fund balance is due to the replenishment of temporarily transferred funds from the Community Connection to Wildlands project. However, this increase was partially offset by project management-related expenditures from the Foothills Open Space Acquisition Stakeholder Engagement project.
