**URGENT – Immediate Ruling Required**  
**Re: June 23, 2025 Motion Record – T-705-13**

Dear Associate Judge Crinson,

**Bell Canada commenced this action against me on May 1, 2025. I am defending myself as a self-represented litigant.**

On June 11, 2025, I submitted a package of evidence to the Court showing that **court exhibits had been altered**. The docket shows it was received, but it has never been posted.

On June 13, 2025, Bell Canada filed a motion for contempt against me personally. That filing, despite being a very serious allegation, was posted immediately.

On June 16, 2025, at the Case Management Conference, you ordered both parties to file: I was to file my defence and motion materials by June 23, 2025, and Bell Canada was to file its responding defence by July 4, 2025. The audio recording confirms this direction.

I complied with your order by filing my Motion Record on June 23, 2025, and serving it on the Court and Bell Canada's counsel. **Bell Canada did not comply with your order and is therefore in default.**

Despite this, **neither my June 11, 2025 evidence package (showing altered court exhibits) nor my June 23, 2025 motion have been posted or ruled on**, while Bell Canada's contempt motion and other filings have been accepted and docketed without delay. In July, August, and September I wrote to the Court requesting direction on this matter. No reply has been given.

This is not the first time this evidence has been presented. The same material showing altered exhibits was filed with the CMC in 2023 and was likewise suppressed.

Under **Rule 3** of the Federal Courts Rules, the Court must secure the just, most expeditious, and least expensive determination of every proceeding on its merits. Under Rule 210, Bell Canada is already in default for failing to comply with your June 16, 2025 order to file by July 4, 2025. My June 23 motion must be dealt with promptly under Rule 369. Continued suppression of my June 11, 2025 evidence and June 23, 2025 motion is inconsistent with these Rules and with the Court's duty to ensure procedural fairness.

**This leaves no ambiguity:**

- Bell Canada commenced this action on May 1, 2025.
- I filed my evidence on June 11, 2025 showing altered court exhibits – received but not posted.
- Bell Canada filed a contempt motion on June 13, 2025 – immediately posted.
- On June 16, 2025 you ordered both parties to file: I was to file by June 23, 2025 and Bell Canada was to file by July 4, 2025.
- I complied on June 23, 2025. Bell Canada defaulted on July 4, 2025.
- I requested Court direction in July, August, and September – no reply.
- The Court has not addressed my filings, while Bell Canada's filings are processed without delay.

I now urgently require the Court to rule on my June 23, 2025 motion and supporting record, and to properly post and consider my June 11, 2025 evidence showing altered court exhibits, without further delay. Continued inaction is denying me procedural fairness and prejudicing my ability to defend myself.

**Bell Canada is already in default of your June 16, 2025 order. Any attempt to file late materials, including the anticipated filing on September 26, 2025, would be improper unless and until this default is formally addressed by the Court.**

Please note that I am copying this correspondence to the Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, the Courts Administration Service, and Bell Canada's counsel in accordance with **Rule 127** of the Federal Courts Rules.
