### Announcing Guest Speaker Lynn Mattucci Esq – WHS Class of 1974

Lynn Mattucci graduated from Winnacunnet with the class of 1974. She went on to graduate from the University of New Hampshire with a Bachelor of Science in Economics. She received her law degree from Syracuse University College of Law in 1981, and a Master of Public Administration from the Maxwell School at Syracuse University the same year. Ms. Mattucci was a federal prosecutor for 30 years with the US Department of Justice. She has tried more than 75 criminal cases in her career. She has prosecuted Public Corruption Cases, Money Laundering cases, Human Trafficking and Asset Forfeiture Cases. Ms. Mattucci also prosecuted Violent Crimes and Homicide Cases during her decade tenure at the United States Attorney's Office in Washington, D.C. She most recently was Special Assistant to the Inspector General, United States Department of Homeland Security from December 2019 to December 2020. She has always been professionally active in issues involving the Rule of Law and international Justice reform and has lectured extensively in these areas. Ms. Mattucci was the Assistant Director for the CEELI Institute from October 2010 to June 2012 while she was on sabbatical from the Department of Justice, United States Attorney's Office for Washington, D.C. She spent extensive periods of time in Prague as part of her duties. Ms. Mattucci has been an avid international traveler, sports fan and participant in sports all of her life. She enjoys playing tennis, skiing, swimming, biking and running. In 2019, she started to participate in triathlons. Since that time, Ms. Mattucci has completed more than twenty-five 1/2 Ironman races and 8 full Ironman 140.6 competitions. She qualified for and completed the World Championship Triathlon in Kona, Hawaii in 2017. Ms. Mattucci lives in Arlington, Virginia with her little Havanese dog, Marley.

### 2021 Alumni Scholarship Recipients

Since 1972 the Alumni Association has been awarding scholarships to the children of alumni with a total value of over \$100,000. In 2021, the Alumni Association was pleased to dedicate the scholarships to the memory of Jane (Worden) Harvey, Hampton Academy Class of 1954. Two \$1,000 scholarships were awarded that are renewable for an additional 3 years.

**Kaitlin Lennox:** Katie is from Hampton Falls and is the daughter of 1986 alumni John Lennox. Katie was valedictorian of her class. At Winnacunnet she participated in National Honor Society, Interact and Best Buddies. She was also on the Indoor and Spring Track Teams as well as playing field hockey in the fall. Katie volunteered at the Miracle Farm Speech Therapy Summer Camp for over six years which led to her decision to study Communication Sciences and Disorders at University of New Hampshire to reach her goal of becoming a Speech Pathologist. She is also running track at UNH.

**Duncan Collins:** Duncan is from Seabrook and is the son of 1986 alumni Susan (Donaldson) Collins. While at Winnacunnet, Duncan was on the swim team for 4 years and holds 4 school records. ### **From 2018 Scholarship Recipient Taylor Yeley**

*For the past four years I have had the privilege of attending the University of Miami where I maintained a 3.9 GPA and made the Dean's List for all 8 semesters. While at the University of Miami, I was a member of the Hurricanettes Danceteam, The President's 100 (campus tour guide and ambassador), The Media Management Association, Delta Kappa Alpha (the film fraternity), and Zeta Tau Alpha (a national sorority). Some of my most memorable experiences were as a Zeta. I held positions of Vice President, Recruitment Chair, and Fashion Show Chair. Most recently as Fashion Show Chair, I organized our annual gala that raised \$75,000 toward Breast Cancer Education and Awareness. I was born and raised in North Hampton, and was SO excited to finally attend WHS where I would meet students from the other 3 towns. I soon found that New Hampshire, although a place full of amazing people, lacked the culture I craved to expand my understanding of the world. Never in my wildest dreams would I have believed that I could go to a place as far away and as cultured as Miami. I grew up with a single mother who also attended Winnacunnet High School, and I was all too familiar with financial struggles. As I look toward the future, I truly can't believe how blessed I have been to live out my dreams. Everything I had ever hoped for in my college experience came to fruition. Upon graduation I will be moving back to New England where I plan to work for an event planning company based in Boston and volunteer at the New England Aquarium in my free time. Most notably, I have been selected to join the New England Patriots Cheerleaders, where I will be able to continue my passion for dance and represent the best team in the NFL! Henry Marsh grew up in North Hampton and graduated from Winnacunnet in 1961. As a senior he participated in the first WHS Varsity wrestling team which was undefeated and won the Northern New England Championship. Henry attended Appalachian State in Boone, NC from 1962-1967 where he held a 26-1 record on the Varsity wrestling team. He was a finalist in the 1968 US Olympic trials for wrestling. Later Henry became a wrestling coach and officiant. He coached at U Mass Lowell and became Head wrestling coach at UNH in 2007, a role he continues to enjoy. Henry has officiated over 50 NCAA Division 1 regional and national tournaments. Henry has been inducted into the USA Hall of Fame, the New England Sports Hall of Fame, and the National Collegiate Wrestling Association Hall of Fame. Henry is quick to acknowledge that he was very lucky to have always had great coaches. In 1967 Henry began his career in education in the Rye School district where he was 3 times nominated as NH Teacher of the Year. He retired from Rye schools in 2005. He was elected to the NH House of Representatives in 2016 where he served until 2018. Henry served on the North Hampton School Board, and then on the Winnacunnet School Board for 9 years where he was the Chairman in these last 6 years. We'd like to thank Henry for his dedication and service to Winnacunnet as an Alum and as a Public Servant.

### **From 2018 Scholarship Recipient Zach Waterhouse**

*This scholarship has meant so much to me as a student, athlete, and member of the community. I understand how fortunate I am to have received the Alumni Scholarship back in 2018. Both of my parents attended Winnacunnet, and my mom still works there, so it is an honor to carry on their legacy through this scholarship. My only goal when searching for a college was to challenge myself; try something completely different than anything I had ever experienced before. I decided to take a risk and attend Emerson College in Boston to pursue a film degree while playing basketball at the collegiate level. Living in downtown Boston is not cheap, so this scholarship is a major reason why I was able to attend, and for that I will forever be grateful. **Robert Reynolds Cushing, Jr.**

July 20, 1952 - March 7, 2022

Winnacunnet Class of 1970

Robert "Renny" Cushing, Class of 1970 left his mark on the Winnacunnet community, as a student, parent and public servant. While at WHS he was the President of the Student Council and Captain of the Football team, while violating the dress code with muttonchop sideburns, getting suspended for said infraction, then after a legal challenge, returning to lead the Football team that year to the State Championship. Renny would return to the WHS Football field to deliver the commencement address 51 years later while battling cancer. Renny was a crusader for justice and someone who sought to right wrongs on all fronts, socially, ecologically, or systematically, he was not one to ever back away from a cause. From the young age of 15, he advocated to lower the voting age on the New Hampshire State House floor, where he would find his place again as a State Representative and leader for his party. His opposition to the Vietnam War led him to Washington DC, while his dedication to nonviolent action through peaceful protests helped establish the Clamshell Alliance that he became co-founder for. This was the first grassroots organization to fight against the Seabrook Atomic Power Plant. He took the path to abolish the death penalty in the State of New Hampshire and saw that through to fruition. As a state representative, Renny put the people first. He advocated for workers by passing the state's whistleblower protection act and fighting repressive right to work legislation. He was a proud card-carrying union member, organizer, and supporter of the state's firefighter, teacher, and municipal employee unions. He was at the forefront of relocating New Hampshire's secure psychiatric unit so vital mental health care can be provided without criminalization. He worked to increase resources for survivors of domestic violence and worked tirelessly to improve the life of his constituents. Renny's life will be remembered by so many in our community.
