Title: The roles of the President and M.C.

Proposed by: The WE Steering Committee

Proposer: Catherine Mayer Seconder: Sandi Toksvig

Type of motion: Business motion

Motion text:

- 1 The Women's Equality Party Conference:
- notes that when the Party was founded, its co-founders Catherine Mayer and Sandi Toksvig
 accepted lifetime roles on the Steering and Executive Committees as President and M.C.
 respectively;
- acknowledges that this was a demonstration of their commitment to the party they founded, and
 intended to ensure continuity and stability in the party's earliest days and to boost the party's
 media profile and fundraising capacity;
- further acknowledges that their continued commitment and input remains of significant value in
 those respects, but that their important contributions should not automatically grant the right to
 seats on the Steering and Executive Committees; and
- resolves to remove that automatic right to seats on the Steering and Executive Committees whilst maintaining their lifetime roles.
- 13 Conference therefore resolves to change the WE Constitution as follows:
- 7.2.1 There are two lifetime posts on the Steering Committee in the Party...
- 15 7.4.4 The Executive Committee shall consist of: the President, the M.C. and five additional
- 16 Members from the Steering Committee...
- 17 7.4.6 ... Meetings of the Executive Committee are chaired by the Party President or another chair
- 18 elected by a member of the committee elected by a simple majority vote...

- 7.4.7 ... In the event of a tied vote, the **Chair** President shall have the casting vote.
- 20 Remove article 7.5.12 (ii) entirely.
- 7.5.17 In the event of a tied vote of the Steering Committee, those present of the Leader, the
- 22 President, the M.C. and the Chairs of the Steering and Executive Committees shall together
- agree on the casting vote.

Motion rationale:

- 24 Catherine Mayer and Sandi Toksvig agreed to take on lifetime roles in the party as a demonstration
- of their commitment to the party they co-founded. Whilst they both will continue in their lifetime roles
- as President and M.C. of the Women's Equality Party, they plan to stand aside from positions on the
- 27 Steering and Executive Committees, which they currently hold by virtue of their roles. This shift would
- of course not prevent them from seeking election to those committees. The time is right to move away
- 29 from automatically granted positions, and this will also increase the weight of elected Steering
- 30 Committee representatives in party decision making.
- 31 They remain fully and passionately committed to the party and asked to make clear, in their
- 32 own words, why they brought this motion:
- "We have always believed in doing politics differently to the extent of co-founding a party that has in
- many respects not only challenged old ways of doing things, but broken the mould and achieved real
- and brilliant change. We could not be more proud of the party or more fervently committed to its aims.
- We accepted lifetime roles in order to help build the party. Our formal positions in the party give helpful
- clarity in interactions with the media and, crucially, with donors and potential donors. We hope that
- you will agree that our input on matters of policy, strategy and operations has also been of value.
- 39 However as the party matures, it seems obvious to us that if we wish to continue feeding into policy,
- 40 strategy and operations, we should earn that privilege rather than assume it. We therefore propose
- 41 these constitutional changes to regularise our positions within the party in that respect while retaining
- the titles that enhance the party's media profile and fundraising capabilities."
- 43 Catherine adds:
- "I am putting myself forward for election to the Steering Committee and would be happy to continue
- serving on the Executive Committee if my contribution is deemed useful. I am offering my services
- because I believe I still have skills, experience and insights to contribute. However, my proudest
- achievement in co-creating WEP is to have helped bring so many brilliant people into the party and
- activism, and I am confident that there are many excellent (and very possibly better) candidates for
- 49 these positions."
